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PROCEEDINGS – FIRST SESSION

Friday, September 16, 2016 1:00 p.m. Wildwood Convention Hall – Wildwood, New Jersey

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Would everyone please be seated. It's 1:00 p.m., let's get started on time.

Good afternoon, Delegates, Life Members, clergy and guests.

I now call to order the 139th Convention of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association.

The exits are to my right and left, in the rear to your right and left. If there is a need to use these exits, please take directions from the dais. Please shut off all pagers, cell phones and put them on vibrate. If anyone needs a hearing device for hearing impaired, please go to the rear of the room.

Listen, this is important: The Manasquan Fire Department had a Line of Duty death, Danny McCann. He responded to an alarm yesterday, went home, died in his sleep. So I'd just like everybody to rise for a moment of silence, please.

(A moment of silence is observed.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: May his soul rest in peace.

Thank you.

Before I proceed, history was made in the Fire Service in this great State of New Jersey. I would like to introduce you to two young ladies, one is from Atlantic County, her name is Cindy Badger. She is the first Executive Committee woman to represent the New Jersey State Firemen's Association in 139 years.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: She has 30 years in the Northvale Fire Department, Life Member of our Association.

Also, the New Jersey State Exempt Firemen's Association elected their first woman officer, First Vice President Elisa Fantozzi, in 130 years.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: She has 39 years, 35 with the Wayne Fire Company and four with the Wanaque Fire Department. She's a Life Member of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association and the Exempts.

Both young ladies, please, rise for a standing round of applause.

CONVENTION BODY: (Standing ovation.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: We will have the Invocation, flag salute and the singing of the National Anthem.

Almighty God, we pause and we stand as proud Americans for our flag. We thank You for those who paid the ultimate price, that we have the liberty and freedom that we have today.

We thank You for this day. We ask You to invoke your blessings upon all that is done through the business, through the fund, through this entire weekend, for the parade.

So we ask You to have Your way and just bless as You mightily bless through the hand of Your Son, the Lord, Jesus Christ.

Amen.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Montvale Fire Department, please present the Colors.

(Colors are presented by the Montvale Fire Department Honor Guard Unit.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Please remain standing. Remove all hats for the Pledge of Allegiance led by Vice President Gunson and "Star Spangled Banner" sung by Firefighter Glenn Roemmich.

(Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag led by Vice President Gunson.)

(National Anthem sung by Firefighter Glenn Roemmich.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Montvale Fire Department, please retire the Colors.

(The Colors are retired.)

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: You may be seated.

COPY OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS TO BE MADE PART OF THE INVITATION AND RECORDED IN THE ABRIDGED REPORT OF THIS MEETING IN FULL.

ANY ASSOCIATION WHICH MAY FAIL IN FILING ITS CREDENTIALS BY MAY 1, 2016 WILL NOT BE SEATED AT THE 2016 CONVENTION."

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Now, it's my pleasure to introduce Congressman LoBiondo, a friend of the Firefighters.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

CONGRESSMAN LO BIONDO: Thank you, Mr. President.

Honored to have the invitation to join you once again. And the message is mainly to say thank you. Thank you for what you do in our communities, thank you for what you do in our country, thank you for being willing to do the right thing all the time.

The Congressional Fire Service in Congress is one of the very bipartisan aspects that continues on. And I'm very proud to have been a member of that over the inception for the Second Congressional District, which, by the way, there are twelve members of Congress from New Jersey. The Second Congressional District, which I'm proud to be welcoming you again to, is forty percent of the state geographically.

We are just nudging up against the \$70 million mark with SAFER and FEMA grants, and just under 300 grants that have been awarded. And that's a tribute to all of you for the work that you do.

So my pledge will be to continue to remember what's good and what's right in America, who represents America.

And I can't help but have this thought with the tremendous National Anthem that we heard, you may know from sometimes in the past I'm not always politically correct, but I would pay to see – I won't mention any names – but I would pay to see what a washed up quarterback from the San Francisco 49ers would do if they sat down in this Hall. I would love to see that.

God bless you. Thank you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: And now our friend, the Mayor of Wildwood, Mr. Ernie Troiano.

MAYOR TROIANO: Mr. President, Brothers and Sister Firefighters, thank you very much for coming here. It is truly our honor once again to have you here.

You may not realize how important it is to not only have this Convention in Wildwood, but the friendships that have been formed over the years. I'm in my 42nd year of doing this, made many, many friends from all over.

And on behalf of all the mayors, commissioners, council people from the City of Wildwood, we wish you nothing but safe. Be safe out there. It's a different world. We are not fighting the same fires we fought before. It's important that you keep your heads and stay educated, the most important thing.

Tonight at nine o'clock, Pine Avenue, there will be a fireworks display.

On a personal note, I'd like to extend a very happy birthday to our President, Mr. Heflich.

Happy birthday.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

MAYOR TROIANO: Everyone have a great time.

Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Thank you, Mayor.

Now, it's my pleasure, extreme great pleasure, and I have her cell phone number, I'd like to introduce New Jersey Lieutenant Governor Kim Guadagno.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR GUADAGNO: All right, it's very hard to decide where to start. So I am going to start with where you just ended and that's with my cell phone number. Now, I'm not going to give it out to the one or two of you who still don't have it, I'm going to start with what happened after I handed it out to all of you last year. And I can't tell how much I was looking forward to coming here today to do just that. That's it.

I was glad that I saw Congressman LoBiondo was here, I'm glad the mayors are here, I'm glad all of you are back here today. But I think you all need to know how much of a sense of humor we have here in this room.

So I'm going to start with Peter Flannery. Where are you Peter? Where are you Glen Rock? By far the funniest text you can get if you are 56 years old and married with three children. And I will prove it, if you want me to. It says "marry me." Come on, how great is that? Peter, I can't, I'm already married.

I was also - I'm glad that didn't come up on the video.

Anyway, it was a blast because I was in the car, I don't take the helicopter.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR GUADAGNO: I was in the car for three hours after I gave you all my cell phone number. And what are you, high school kids? You dared each other, call her, see if she answers the phone. And so you did. Maybe fifteen times I got phone calls. "Oh, it's her, really. Humm-ah-nahhumm-ah-nah-humm-ah-nah." And then you would hear people laughing in the background as the day got longer and longer.

Yes, by ten o'clock I did have to turn the phone off and you all know why I did. And I won't repeat those texts because we know that you guys are having a lot of fun down here and you should have a lot of fun down here because you work so very, very hard.

Why did I give you my cell phone number? I gave you my cell phone number because most of you, and I know there's a lot of Paid Firemen in the room who also Volunteer, but most of you have a day job so most of you go back to work.

So I gave you my cell phone number so that you would use it in your day job or your night job, meaning your volunteer work, so that if you were having problems with the State of New Jersey you would get the help you needed.

Now, I wish, I wish you didn't have to call the Lieutenant Governor at all hours of the day and night and ask her for help, but that's not the real world we live in. I firmly believe you should have access to your elected public officials. You know your mayors, you know your councilmen, sometimes you know your freeholders, but rarely do you think you get an opportunity to talk to the person who lives down the hall taking a left and a right from the Governor of the State of New Jersey, who, with the exception of EZPass can get just about anybody on the phone. Except EZPass.

Now, just to prove that this cell phone is not just a joke, I would read to you the 35 texts I have already gotten from you in this room, I'm invited to your annual Wildwood party tonight. Your hotel is here. I hope – no, no, I can't repeat that one. Watchung is in the house; Chester called me yesterday; a shoutout to Chester; a

shoutout to Salem County; a shoutout, by the way, to the most important Fire Company in my life is my own, and those that support them, Monmouth Beach is in the house. I know you are. Raise your hand Monmouth Beach. You are over there in the corner somewhere.

And Monmouth County, and I'm so sorry, that we lost one of our own in Manasquan last night and I'm glad that we started today with a moment of silence because it could happen to any one at any time and we need to remember that. We need to remember the sacrifices all of you make, the physical toll it takes on you personally.

And we know the physical toll it takes on you personally. We saw evidence of that just last night when Firefighter McCann didn't wake up this morning.

We know that, believe it or not, and these numbers are staggering, there is one fire in New Jersey every nineteen minutes. We know that one Firefighter is injured in every thirteen and half hours. We know that there were 27,000 fires reported in 2015, which included 15,000 structure fires. We know that in 2015 you had at least five Line of Duty deaths, at least five, probably more. And we have already had at least two this year.

Your business takes a serious physical toll on you personally. So we thank you.

It's not just a physical toll, it's a mental toll.

I was talking to the South River Firemen today, and I said this last year I'm going to say it again, the most graphic evidence of that is when I walked into a room for a fundraiser a couple of years ago and the siren went off, everybody at the table ran out because they were all Volunteer Firemen. They left their food on the table, their beers on the table and they went out to save somebody's life or property. If you are not working, you are allowed to drink a beer.

But it tells you everything you need to know, because that mental toll is you never know when the siren is going to go off. You never know when you are going to be called to duty. And oh, by the way, neither does your family. Your wives, your spouses, your partners, your children, they never know, Christmas, holiday dinner tables, when you are going to have to get up and serve the people of your county, of your city, of your town.

So the mental toll is something we need to recognize and thank you for.

And, finally, the financial toll. The financial – yes, there are Paid Firemen and they earn their pay. But the Volunteer Firemen in New Jersey, there's at least, let me get it right, at least 50,000 Firemen. If you pay them all \$75 average, \$75,000 is an average salary plus benefits – somebody is correcting me right now on my cell phone. I love this crowd.

But, you know, if I had to pay all of you, if we had to pay all of you, the taxpayers had to pay all of you, do you know how much money we would have to raise in taxes, \$2.25 billion. So it's a physical toll, it's a mental toll on you and your families and your communities and it's a financial toll if you don't continue to volunteer.

So I know one of your biggest challenges is recruitment. And I look to you to help me help you recruit more. I have got one text somebody says "pay into the pension," we –

Sore subject. Come on. Got to have a sense of humor. Some say let's fix LOSAP. In my town I helped institute LOSAP. Quite frankly don't know how it's working, but it was one way we could encourage Volunteers to volunteer for life. Those are a couple of ideas. You guys have to text me the rest.

What do you see working in your communities, so we can replace you with the next generation of Firemen, Volunteered or Paid.

I just came here today, one, to laugh a little bit about the cell phone because it was fabulous, but also to tell you that I really do – we really do appreciate all you do every day.

The Eagleswood Fire Company was not afraid to use my cell phone. Where's Eagleswood? Just so you are all comfortable using my cell phone, they called me the day before a parade and usually they say – oh, know, let me take this one back, wrong story. The Chief called me and he said EZPass was charging them for going to a fire. I said sure you were. And he said, Well, look at the pictures, I will send them to you, because the two fire trucks behind me are evidence that we were really going to a fire. But you know how New Jersey is, we charged them for going through EZPass anyway. It took us a little while and I literally had to drive down to EZPass to get in the front door. But we were able to waive the charges for that silly EZPass blooper where you should be allowed to go to an emergency on their own time with a Volunteer. So keep that cell phone number.

Here's the one I was talking about a minute ago, Milford, West Milford Fire Company, are you in the house? I can't hear you. So which one of you called me the day before you wanted to stop in High Point Park? Right here, stand up. He was, like – the DEP, that's somebody that works for me, the DEP says you can't stop in High Point Park anymore on your way to the parade. You've been doing it for years. You called me, I called the head of the DEP and I said, "Really, these guys stage there every year." And we were able to fix that.

So call me at least a week ahead of time, not 24 hours ahead of time because it will happen again next year. I can't stop some things in the bureaucracy.

And the last one was when we were having a problem with the MVC. Anybody have any problems with the MVC lately? Well, try to register your ambulance. Because Maplewood tried and tried and tried. And where are you Maplewood? Where are you? Right in the front. Not here. Maybe embarrassed to raise your hand.

My point is, Maplewood couldn't get their ambulance registered without paying a fine. Does that make any sense to you? Why would we charge you to register an ambulance? Why would we charge you for going through the EZPass?

So every now and then, I know it's rare, the State of New Jersey does something stupid.

So, when that happens, try to fix it once and then the next one, the next one, next phone call or text should be to me. Because at least I will try and at least then you can blame me as the representative of the state government.

So I'm going to give you my cell phone number again. I'm turning the phone on for jokers in the room who think it's really not my cell. I'm going to save you all those phone calls for the afternoon's entertainment. And I'm going to give it to you right now, it really is the same one as last year, 609-575-8111. 609-575-8111. Somebody has to call it because otherwise nobody will believe it.

Cathie's husband, Al, nicknamed Foxy, a 31-year Member and ex-Chief of the Blauvelt Volunteer Fire Department, Blauvelt, New York, died in the Line of Duty on October 26, 1996. Cathy has three sons and has been volunteering for the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation since 1998.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

MS. DE FLUMERE: Good afternoon.

On behalf of my survivor family here today and all over the country, I would like to thank the New Jersey State Firemen's Association for this opportunity to speak today. It is very important to us as survivors to thank you for your continued support. We need you.

The National Fallen Firefighters Foundation is a tax exempt non-profit that was established by Congress in 1992 to honor our Fallen Heroes and assist their families and coworkers; however, the Foundation is not funded by our government, we depend on grant money and your donations.

Our country will be coming together on October 8th and 9th in Emmitsburg, Maryland to honor 79 Firefighters who died in 2015, 11 from previous years and 22 F.D.N.Y. Firefighters who have died from 9/11 cancer-related illnesses.

A few weeks after on October 26th, my sons and I will be remembering my husband, Al De Flumere, also known as Foxy, on the 20th anniversary of his Line of Duty death. As you already know, Foxy was a 31-year Member of the Blauvelt Volunteer Fire Company in Blauvelt, New York. He died saving his family in a house fire. He led myself and our sons, ages eight and four, to safety and went back in for our six-year old. Unfortunately, Foxy and Matthew never made it out. They were found in each other's arms.

My journey with the Foundation began when my husband was honored in 1997. I have attended every Memorial Weekend in October since, except for one. I became a member of a survivor family that no one wants to belong to, but we are so thankful that we have one another.

I have spoken at fundraisers for the Foundation, such as golf tournaments, NASCAR events and stair climbs.

The Foundation offers so much support for the survivors. Your donations help to fund our survivor conference, our Hal Bruno Bereavement Camps for children of Fallen Firefighters and scholarship programs.

My youngest son was the recipient of four years of scholarships while he attended college. Travis has followed in his dad's footsteps and has been a Volunteer in the same Company for eight years, with his dream of becoming a Career Firefighter which will hopefully come true some day.

Your donations not only help the survivors, but they also help you. We have so many opportunities for training for you, Be a Hero Save a Hero, Everyone Goes Home, Local Assistance State Team and Taking Care of Our Own. There are many online training programs on the Foundation website that I invite you to visit as you need to take care of you.

I ask you when you leave here today to reach into your pocket and drop what you can in our boots.

In closing, I would like to quote a press release made on August 12th from the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation and several other associations: Please do remain conscious about your health, your environment and your surroundings.

Likewise, if you think someone else is being less attentive to their health and safety, please say something. Let them know that at the end of every shift we want to be sure everyone goes home to their loved ones.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Next, we have the President of the New Jersey State Firemen's Benevolent Association, but he had different plans, had to fly out of the state. To represent him is their Vice President Rich Mikutsky.

MR. MIKUTSKY: Thank you, Mr. President.

I will be brief this morning. First of all on behalf of Ed Donnelly, our President, he had to fly out to Phoenix to the State P.B.A. Convention, where they are unrolling and rolling out the proposal that we have been working on with the State P.B.A. almost two years now, with taking over and securing our pension system from the state. So he's out there. He sends his apologies, but wishes everyone a good Convention.

We just wrapped up a tremendous four-day convention ourselves, the F.M.B.A., in Atlantic City. We wrapped up yesterday. We were very fortunate on Wednesday to have six gubernatorial candidates come and all be in the room at the same time and address our Members.

MR. KOSMOSKI: Executive Officers, Life Members, Delegates, clergy and honored guests, I bring you greetings on behalf of the New Jersey Volunteer Fire Chiefs Association and best wishes for a successful and beneficial Convention.

Last year I mentioned that the New Jersey Volunteer Chiefs was going to take the lead in supporting the proposed Sprinkler bill for new construction of single and two-family homes. This bill has been approved and passed by both houses of Legislators on two previous occasions. Unfortunately, when these bills were sent to the Governor for approval, he vetoed them twice. He wanted changes made before he would sign them into law.

In a meeting last week with the sponsor of the bill, Assemblyman John Wisniewski, he advised me that the current version of the bill, A3334, will once again be brought up for a vote in the Assembly and Senate in the upcoming months. If all goes as it has in the past these bills will once again be approved by both houses.

I said the Governor had vetoed this bill because he wanted changes made. Changes were made; they have been made pertaining to the Governor's concerns and sponsors' concerns.

The sponsor also told me that considerations were made as a result of the Avalon fire in Edgewater last year. This Sprinkler bill will be beneficial to both the residents and us as Firefighters in a wooden stick construction used in these structures.

I urge you to contact your Assembly representative, your state Senator, to once again get behind this bill and approve it. It is also just as important or more so to contact the Governor on your Department stationery and recommend to him that we pass this most needed bill. And maybe a call on that cell phone may also urge him to pass that bill for us.

You know whose cell phone I'm talking about.

So once again get behind the bill, we need it for the Fire Service, we need it for the residents of New Jersey.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Next, an old friend of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association, Mr. Tom Campbell, Director of Marketing for Deborah Heart and Lung Center.

Tom.

MR. CAMPBELL: Good afternoon, everyone. It's always, always a pleasure to stand here before you.

I'd like to first personally thank George and Frank for their continued support this past year. Both of them personally contacting me and referring a number of Firefighters to me directly who needed help at Deborah. So I appreciate their support.

Each year I look forward to getting my little guest badge as part of the Convention and it is an honor to get that. I looked at them before the Convention and noticed my first badge was 118th Annual Convention. Quick math told me that was 21 years. And I thought that's a very long time for two organizations to partner together. We are very, very proud of that.

In those 21 years we have seen at Deborah thousands and thousands of Firefighters and their family members. And we've also saved hundreds and hundreds of lives and we continue to be proud of that.

For those of you who are new and don't know of all those thousands and thousands of Members and their family members, not one person was ever sent a bill from Deborah. Not one person paid a co-pay, not one person paid a deductible. Not one person gave one penny to Deborah. And we continue to be proud of our tradition of not billing patients.

Thank you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

MR. CAMPBELL: It's something everyone at Deborah is very proud of, all the doctors, nurses, technicians.

All of those people who did come to Deborah over those years also were able to receive top quality care. Deborah continues to be the number one hospital in the State of New Jersey according to the federal government and many independent organizations. We continue to roll out many new procedures and technologies among the first in the state and we have also 30 or so ongoing research studies. One of which I wanted to tell you about we just started last month some of you may be interested in. It's a clinical research trial on high blood pressure. If you have one or two medications and your blood pressure is under control or if you have two or three, four medications and your blood pressure is not under control, you may be eligible for this study.

The study is looking at whether the kidney arteries actually send messages to the brain to raise blood pressure. So if you or someone you know has high blood pressure under control or not, see me in the Health Fair tomorrow, I have a flyer on how you can enroll in this study.

Next Saturday, a week from today, we are doing a free screening for peripheral artery disease, PAD. If you have leg pain while walking that goes away with rest or you have legs that are fatigued, you may have a blockage in your legs. We are doing a free screening at Deborah. You must call and make an appointment time for that screening next Saturday. I have a flyer on that as well.

Last year I mentioned a new procedure we just started, I didn't have any flyers on it, it was for people who have A-FIB and who take Coumadin or Warfarin blood thinners. We've now done 150 of these procedures non-surgically. They seal off the lower part of your heart that causes clots and 95 percent of the people have been getting off Warfrin and Coumadin. I have a flyer on that as well. So please see me tomorrow for any of this new and breaking stuff that we are doing.

You hear me every year talk about the gift from Captain Buscio. Lot of people came in this morning who have been to the program. I congratulate you for that. Many of you out here have not done the program yet. This year is a good time to do it. Free screening whether you go to Newark, whether you go to Deborah, please pick up the phone, make that call. It has saved hundreds and hundreds of lives around the state and we want to keep you healthy.

Finally, make sure you have our little card. If you have a problem, need a family member to get in, give us a call. My name and number continues to be on the card.

We are very proud at Deborah to be known at the hospital that takes care of Firefighters, the hospital in the state that treats Firefighters well and provides them the latest in technology and service.

So thank you again for your time. We will be in the Health Fair tomorrow morning if you'd like to come in for a screening.

And, as always, thank you for your attention.



## SECRETARY'S REPORT

## TO THE OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE NEW JERSEY STATE FIREMEN'S

ASSOCIATION IN CONVENTION ASSEMBLED, WILDWOOD, NEW JERSEY,

SEPTEMBER 16<sup>th</sup> AND 17<sup>th</sup>, 2016.

Your Secretary takes pleasure in submitting his Annual Report for the year 2015-2016.

During the year 12,251 pieces of mail were received at the office and 21,828 pieces of U.S. Mail were sent out. All inquiries were handled with the utmost care by our office staff and they are to be commended.

Your State Association consists of 538 local associations, containing an active membership of 75,028. During the year 1,861 applications for membership were processed. There were 334 applications for Life Membership approved, making a grand total of 12,338 Life Members.

Total members with qualifying certificates is 43,268.

Total members working toward Qualification is 14,098.

I wish to thank the Officers, Executive Committee, Office Staff and all at the local level for their cooperation and support for the past year.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Okay, I will go to President's Report. I will be quick.

Delegates, Life Members, Reverend clergy and guests, good afternoon.

I would like to thank the Officers, Executive Committeemen, Officers of the 538 Relief Associations for their help and support again this year.

This year on May 16th we deposited into 538 Associations' checking accounts \$16,029,560, which was \$680,672 more than last year.

Ladies and gentlemen, our Association is worth almost a quarter of a billion dollars. That's a lot of money to protect.

For the fiscal year that ends in June, we paid out 830 death claims for \$9,226,993.99. And for five meetings for the new fiscal year, we paid out 141 death claims for \$1,570,731.

As of July 1st, the death benefit was raised to \$11,500; three times for the Line of Duty death.

During that actuary study to raise the death benefit, the average age of Firefighters in this state is 53. That's scary. That's not good.

The 21 Associations that had IRS problems are corrected. And Associations that are on the fiscal year not calendar year will be corrected next year.

At our May 14 Executive meeting, a vote was taken not to raise the age 13 to 7, leave it at 45. At that same meeting, the Executive Committee voted to raise the special relief to \$5,000 as of January 1, 2017, which means once the white form is filled out and the yellow is applied for and filled out properly, every Association in this room could pay up to \$5,000 before the pink form is needed.

Special relief for the year, we received 57 applications, denied one for \$49,250; supplemental, we received 61 applications, denied one for \$270,012.55. Last year we approved 120 applications for \$519,921.24.

Ladies and gentlemen, your Relief Associations, you have to start giving out more relief. Believe me, we are almost \$300,000 behind last year.

We got jammed up about eight or nine years ago when a state gentleman found out we were giving out more money for Convention expenses than relief. So, please, search out those people who need the Relief.

We sent out an affidavit with the green sheets that the President, Secretary and Chief must sign that everyone under the age must be offered a Membership application. If they refuse to accept one, a waiver form has to be issued and notarized, signed by the Chief and Secretary and sent back. So far we have received 395. That's 73.4 percent.

Any request your Association receives for an OPRA request or a letter from the I.R.S., notify our Office immediately.

With phone calls made by the Officers and the Executive Committee, talking at meetings to change your Officers, this year again, 13 Associations are not being seated. That's not good. I'm probably embarrassed even to read that.

Important: Effective February 20th, 2016 at the Executive meeting any Firefighter found guilty of theft or malfeasance against the New Jersey State Firemen's Association shall forfeit their Membership in the New Jersey State Firemen's Association and any benefits that they or the family would be entitled to, that means no death benefit for the family and no relief. Also, any other Member convicted of the following N.J.S.A. statutes, arson and related offenses as contained in N.J.S.A. 2C:17-1, false alarms, shall forfeit their benefits also.

Important: Again, we now have a health care plan that will take effect January lst, 2017 to help a Firefighter who would like to stay home as they get up in age and not go into a nursing facility. We will have a qualified licensing company with the State of New Jersey, or any other state where the Firefighter may reside, come in and help with taking the Firefighter for a walk, shower, getting him or her out of bed, cleaning the house, cooking or whatever.

This program is also available to every Firefighter in this room if needed up to \$600 a month. This health care plan is separate from your Relief Association requirements.

Information and forms of the new health plan will be sent out to all Associations in October.

Since we are under Election Laws of the State of New Jersey, there will be no nominations off the floor. You can still write in a name to vote for the candidate of your choice.

Also, when you are voting tomorrow, you vote for the candidate of your choice, you have to fill in the circle. There is no more from the arrow to the tail. Fill in the circle. It's important.

Also, tomorrow if anyone is distributing election material, they have to comply with State Statute 19:34-7, you must be one hundred feet away from the entrance Convention Center to loiter, electioneer or solicit any voter. It is a disorderly person offense, if you do attempt to do it. No one is allowed inside on the day of election with any kind of election material, hats, shirts, buttons or banners, under State Statute 19:34-15 which means electioneering within or about the polling place.

Each candidate will be given three minutes later, if they choose to talk, as they appear on the ballot.

We also purchased property on Route 34, Wall Township, lot size 3.7 acres, for \$900,999. We are looking to build a 15,000- or 16,000-square foot building. Estimated cost per square foot range from \$150 to \$350 depending on interior finish.

We received two bids for architectural services that were reviewed by our Attorney with the recommendation the Committee chooses FVHD. They are located in Trenton and myself and Vice President Gunson met with them last Friday. There was a lot of talk, probably a lot of Firefighters that know about it, if you are going to retire from any public job you have in this state, Fire Department, Career Department, you have to take 180-day leave of absence. Very important. Do not be gainfully employed in the same community where you worked. The I.R.S. will take part of your pension if you attempt to do it. The Senate passed the bill S2107, 34 to nothing, to stop that. Also, the Assembly has been out, they will come back after election, all we need is a letter from the I.R.S. to say that wasn't the intent of the law. Second Assistant Secretary Naylis has been working on this for over three months. We did not produce this bill. We are trying to help every Firefighter or every public employee in the State of New Jersey.

I have sent a privacy authorization form to Congressmen Lance and Pascrell informing them also, make them aware what has to be done immediately.

So, thank you for listening and God bless America.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: We will have candidates speak as they are on the ballot.

The first for President, Richard W. Vander Berg.

Richard, would you please step up to the microphone? You will have three minutes to speak.

MR. VANDER BERG: Give me three minutes and we will change the world.

My name is Richard Vander Berg and I'm running for the President of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association.

I need to apologize for not attending all the county caucuses, as I work for a long shoreman in the Ports of Newark and Elizabeth. In August we had to work, like 60, 80 hours.

As a long shoreman, we have a health insurance plan and it's tiered. You get, basically, 700 hours, you get basic insurance; 1100 hours, you get the medium insurance; 1300 hours, you get all the bells and whistles with prescription and stuff like that.

I want to be clear to everybody that if I'm elected President of this Organization, I will give up my full-time job as long shoreman. A lot of people have asked me that question, I want to make it clear.

I want to know why can't the Firefighting Service do the exact same thing with 30 to 39 percent attendance at fires getting basic health insurance; 40 to 49 percent getting medium insurance; and 50 percent and above getting all the bells and whistles.

And you say, "How would you pay for this coverage?" I have heard that there are \$172 million in assets that are combined in this Organization, plus as 501c3 corporation, we could also get donations from corporations.

Currently there is a \$55 million settlement of a lawsuit for a company in New Jersey. Possibly we could get them interested in gaining some local good will by supporting the benefits for the Firefighters.

Four basic ideas I had: One was a new phone system for the Office. The one that you call in on the weekends, if you call, it says – it doesn't take messages, for starters. After hours it tells you that the Office is closed, but you can't leave any messages.

Second thing is to preprint the red and white forms. Anybody that's a Secretary, I have been one since 1990 of the Local Relief you can't – it's very difficult and frustrating to type them.

Three, expand the master list so it has the addresses of all the people.

And last but not least, let's end this constant year after year of between 11 and 17 organizations, local rganizations that can't come to Wildwood and everybody doesn't get paid, Chief, Delegates, Life Members.

That's all I have to say. I tried to keep it as short as I could.

I ask for your support and I need your vote.

Again, my name is Rich Vander Berg.

Thank you, very much.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Next we will hear from Vice President Gunson running for President.

Frank, my pleasure to introduce you.

VICE PRESIDENT GUNSON: Thank you, Mr. President.

The Treasurer asked me to make one correction: We are not a 501c3, we are a 4, we can't take donations.

Thank you.

Delegates, Life Members, invited guests, Chiefs, for those that don't know me, I'm Frank Gunson, a candidate for President this year. I proudly served this great Association for over 22 years as your Executive Committeeman from Mercer County and nine years as the Vice President.

Prior to becoming Vice President, I was employed at PSE&G for over 42 years, working field operations, budgets. When I went to Newark, I went into purchasing and spent many years in IT and methods department.

The experience that I gained there has prepared me well for this was an asset to the N.J.S.F.A. As Vice President, I have been the Office Administrator and taken lead roles in many areas. I oversaw the upgrade to our system and re-write and purchase of new hardware. This has included working now on the new health care that will go into our system. I am the only one familiar with our supplier and our Organization at this time with how the system works. I've worked with Banking and Insurance on defining our requirements for the auto surplus line automation system and supplied the carriers with upgrade tables, with ISOs, that you no longer hear, they are using our zip codes. This has increased the amount of money of the funds that we have received locally and in our Office. In turn, it has allowed the Officers and Executive Committee to increase the death benefit, special relief fund and institute the health care program. At this time I'd like to recognize Joseph Hankins, Executive Committeeman from Ocean County, for spearheading this program.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

VICE PRESIDENT GUNSON: I have worked closely with the prosecutor's office, bonding company and insurance company on several issues. I am currently working with our Attorneys and the other Officers on the Building Committee on the design, planning and construction of our new Office. Also work daily with the Executive Committee, Association Members to resolve local issues.

I am well prepared to take the New Jersey Firemen's Association forward and pledge to you a lead role in our Association and provide continuity with our current projects. Whenever any one has called, visited the Office, I have been accessible, worked with them and will remain so. I can only do this with your support tomorrow and ask that you vote for me as your next President of this fine Association.

In closing, God bless America, may He watch over our Police Officers, First Responders and Troops.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: The President is next.

Good afternoon, Delegates, Life Members and Chiefs.

I have been an Officer of the N.J.S.F.A. for 30 years, the last nine as your President. During those 30 years, I have worked with the other Officers and Executive Committeemen for the good of this great Association.

In the past nine years, we raised the death benefit from \$8,600 to \$11,500. Our Association's assets went from \$170 million close to a quarter of a billion dollars. We raised the special relief to \$5,000 this coming first of the year so every Member is on the same level of relief after their initial local relief payment is met. Also starting the health care act after the first of the year. We instituted the platoon system and lowered the percentage from 50 to 60 percent to help the Volunteers get their percentage.

As your President, after I leave my office daily, I spend many afternoons, evenings and weekends throughout the state attending wakes to offer my condolences and inform and assure that the family has been made aware there is a death benefit and financial help as needed. Also I attend your Chiefs, Company and county meetings to keep your Associations informed, attend your Firemen's events and parades.

There are times when I have to deliver bad news when Officers fail to get reports in on time or speak at your caucus on getting agenda resolution passed for the Executive Committee. I am asking for your vote again to reelect myself so I can be your President when we implement the health care act for any Firefighter if needed and make that my legacy.

Thank you for listening. God bless and protect our Firefighters, Police Officers and our men and women in our Military and God bless America.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Next candidate is for Vice President.

First, Neil J. Gallo.

MR. GALLO: What, no boos?

Good afternoon, Brother and Sister Firefighters, clergy, invited guests, I'm Neil J. Gallo and I'm running for the position of Vice President. I'm a nine-year Executive Committeeman, 15-year Legislative Committeeman, I'm a 42-year Volunteer Firefighter and a tenured Chief Officer in two separate Departments. I'm a 25-year facilities manager. As you are well aware, we are constructing a building. I bring the skills, the talent and the knowledge to get that building built and done right.

I wish you would endorse me for the job of Vice President this year.

I'm keeping it simple, smooth and easy. Thank you much for your attention.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Next, Robert F. Ordway.

MR. ORDWAY: Delegates, Life Members, Officers and guests, good afternoon.

My name is Robert Ordway and I'm running for Vice President of this great Association.

I attended and spoke at 16 of the 21 caucuses. Of the five that were held on duplicate nights, Secretary Finnegan and First Assistant Secretary Genovay were kind enough to speak for me.

Literature with my resume was available at all caucuses, it was mailed to each Local Association. It was e-mailed to your local Officers whose e-mail addresses were on file.

I am state certified as a municipal finance officer, county finance officer, tax collector and qualified purchasing agent. I am currently employed as a municipal CFO, tax collector, purchasing agent, treasurer and IT liaison for a municipality here in New Jersey.

I have been the Executive Committeeman representing Bergen County since 2005 and Treasurer of my local Association since 1994. There are many other organizations I belong to or am an officer of both firematic and non-firematic.

Last year was the lowest amount of relief awarded in over the past eight years by our Associations. For the second year in a row statewide Convention and administrative expenses exceeded the amount of relief paid out. We need to do more to track down our retired and former Members or their surviving spouses to see if they need help. In most cases the surviving spouses are unaware of the Relief Association or that they may even be eligible for relief.

Trenton is always watching. And if we do not do our job, they will take over and say they can do it better. Just look at how well they managed the funding of the Transportation Trust Fund, pension and education. And I am sure the Governor needs more money to take his helicopter and go around the country for all these political things he does. Let's not give them a chance to use our money inappropriately.

We need to do more to remind our local Associations of the due dates of the reports. In the last three years, 46 Associations have not been seated.

I have been fortunate as Bergen County's Executive Committeeman in that in the last ten years, Bergen County's 68 Associations have all been seated.

Finally, we are seeing more and more state rules and guidelines coming into play with our Associations: Record retention, OPRA, open public meetings, election guidelines and who knows what's next. I believe that my background in municipal government will be an asset implementing any regulations that we are required to follow.

I ask that you please consider voting for me tomorrow morning. In the last few years we have seen a lot of anger and animosity brewing around the state and at this Convention. I believe it is time for a change and that we need to move forward. I believe that I will be a good fit in the State Office working for you. And remember, folks, the State Office works for you, not the other way around.

So, please vote for me, Robert Ordway for Vice President. I'm the name sandwiched in the middle in the Vice President section.

Thank you for your time. And when you leave the island tomorrow or Sunday, have a safe drive home.

God bless our Troops, our First Responders, their families and God bless America.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Next, Thomas J. Pelaia.

Tommy.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

MR. PELAIA: Good afternoon.

I'm Tom Pelaia and I'm running for Vice President of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association.

I'm a 35-year Member of the Bloomfield Firemen's Relief Association. I retired from the Bloomfield Fire Department in 2011 after a 31-year career. I was the Fire Official and Administrative Officer of the Fire Department for my final 13 years.

I have been the Executive Committeeman from Essex County for the past seven and I was the Legislative Committeeman prior to that for 17 years, a position I also held for eight years in the New Jersey State F.M.B.A. I have been involved as a Volunteer with the Bell and Siren Club of Essex County for over 40 years and I currently work in the Borough of Paramus.

I have always said that the State Association along with its benefits is the greatest asset a Firefighter in New Jersey has. You know we receive our funds from a two percent tax and we are the only state in the union that controls the money, collects the money and distributes the money to our Associations.

We heard this afternoon our Association is worth almost a quarter of a billion dollars. We also hear every day how Trenton is broke. They don't have any money for pensions, taxes, education, transportation or whatever. We need strong leadership in this Association before they start looking at us. We need to protect these benefits and hopefully increase the benefits in the future.

The State, as I said, is always looking over our shoulder so we must remain strong. If I am elected with my experience in Trenton, I am qualified to tackle the problem if it ever comes about.

**Scope:** This Resolution is proposed to provide active firefighters from both career and volunteer fire companies or fire departments affiliated with a Local Relief Association a window of opportunity to receive back credit toward a qualifying certificate provided the member served a minimum of sixty (60) consecutive months as an active firefighter with documented proof by the Local Relief Association.

Whereas; Active firefighters, both career and volunteer, are serving throughout the State of New Jersey and are not members to the New Jersey State Firemen's Association ("NJSFA").

Whereas; The Local Relief Associations are encouraging active firefighters to apply for membership to the NJSFA. Whereas; many of these firefighters have already served several years with their respective fire companies or fire departments and are deserving of credit in the Association.

 Whereas;
 Firefighters, both career and volunteer, who served a minimum of sixty (60) consecutive months

 with their respective fire companies or departments (not including transfer time from other departments) and are
 not members of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association shall be afforded a window of opportunity to receive

 full back credit of up to sixty (60) months towards a Qualifying Certificate.

Whereas; Said Firefighters who have not exceeded the age limitation as outlined by the WSEA and who have submitted an approved application with the required physical to the State Association Office attaching documented proof of the firefighter's service for up to sixty (60) months of service shall be considered for the swindow of opportunity. Whereas; Once the State Association Office reviews and accepts the firefighter as a member by assigning a line number with the Association and notification is given to the Local Relief Association of said line number and upon review from the Advisory Committee, the State Association Office shall approve or deny, in whole or in part, the qualifying back credit sought.

Whereas; An approved member will start to accrue time from the date membership was approved and recorded on the membership form. An approved member shall receive back credit, in whole or in part, for up to and not exceeding sixty (60) months until 84 months have been attained for Qualification.

Whereas; Benefits of the Association shall follow as set forth with standing policies with regard to prorated or full issuance.

**Now therefore be it resolved;** This is a onetime window of opportunity that will take effect on the date of an affirmative vote of this Resolution and expires December 31st in the calendar year it is accepted. It is the responsibility of the Local Relief Associations to notify its members and initiate this process before it expires. No applications for back credit or exceptions will **be** accepted for consideration upon expiration.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Playing of the bagpipes, please.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: We will now have our Memorial Tribute.

**REVEREND SCHAFER:** You may be seated.

I just wanted to say that I'm very grateful. I know Chaplain Wittik is very grateful for the kindness that you've shown us and the courtesy. We thank you, very much. We are very, very proud and honored to be part of this Organization.

Last year, when I returned home from this Convention, I had an e-mail from the Captain from one of the agencies that was here. And he said when he arrived home he heard that one of his Firefighters had committed suicide while they were here at the Convention.

This service is to remember those who died in the last year. But I just want to address something this morning that sometimes we put it on the back burner, we don't like to talk about it. And the fact is we do lose Brothers and Sisters behind what goes on in the mind and in the heart.

We are so grateful for Deborah. Deborah is great for taking care of our bodies and our physical health. But what are we doing to take care of the pain, the scars that you Brothers and Sisters deal with on a daily basis?

The sights, the sounds, the smells, the trauma. You see, trauma is whenever the left side of our brain, which has logic, loses connection with the right side of our brain that has all the sights, sounds and smells that we've experienced since the time we were born.

And nobody like a First Responder has such a large baggage of sights and sounds and smells through your careers. And what trauma is, is the breakdown between the ability to comprehend and to put sense to the things that you see and experience every day. That's what trauma is.

One of my agencies that I serve we had two Firefighters commit suicide, take their lives in the past year. I have been 50 years in Emergency Services from Law Enforcement to EMT Chaplain, nine months at Ground Zero. And I'm tired of hearing the statement when we come back from that call that leaves those scars up here when somebody says, "suck it up man, get over it." Those words can end a career.

As a Chaplain I believe God has put us Chaplains there to help you finish your career, to help you to deal with those incidents that you face every day. Because every call, every experience that you have on the job leaves a mark in your memory. And if you have been in it for many, many years, you know what I'm talking about.

Ten years ago, 15 years ago we didn't have balloons and flowers placed along the road and placed at certain locations. But now every where we turn we see memorials, we see balloons, we see flowers, we see memories, and they trigger that event and it's always there.

And being in Emergency Services so long I can almost look in your eyes and see your pain. You don't talk about it. You don't share the hurt. What are we going to do to address these needs?

Sir Winston Churchill at Oxford University commencement, he stepped up to the podium, he leaned his elbows on the podium and he said, "Never give up." There was a standing ovation.

He looked at the crowd and he said, "Never give up." He again got a standing ovation and went back and sat in his seat. Those three words can save your life, can save your career.

Last year we gave out about a couple of thousand of those positive self-talk cards. I hope they helped you. This year we passed out a card with an egret on it with a frog in his mouth, "Never give up. Never give up."

And they say that when you talk about it, it shows that you are weak. When you talk about what you have been through all these years, oh, it's weak, man, don't be a sissy, don't be a baby. Talking about it is a strength, to be able to talk to somebody, be able to share with somebody.

And let me just make a few comments that I think will help all of us: You can't change what you refuse to confront. And the longer you refuse to confront the things that you've experienced and gone through, through life, they will always be there. They need to be confronted.

And here's another thought for you: You can avoid reality, but you cannot avoid the consequences of avoiding reality. Let that sink in.

An emotional sickness is avoiding reality at any cost. Emotional health is facing reality at any cost. We face it. We don't bury it. We talk about it.

Anxiety is even a better teacher than reality. For one contemporarily vague reality by avoiding distasteful situations and most of what we do is distasteful. But anxiety is a source of education always present because one carries it within. We carry it within. We share with our Brothers and Sisters.

None of us have control of what happens. But we do have control over our thoughts and our words and our actions after we go through the experiences we go through.

So what do we do after a highly emotional graphic call? We go home, we expect things to be normal, we expect our families to accept us. But, unfortunately, our normal will never be expected to be a constant replay. It's a constant replay of what we just went through.

Some of the greatest battles we face is not the fires, not the crashes, not the rescues. Some of the greatest battles we face is the battle of the mind. The battle of the mind, what do you do with all that information, all those experiences, all those things you have gone through in your career? You are not alone. Everybody in this room knows what we are talking about.

Medication is not the answer. Oh, yeah, after the call you go to the local gin mill, get a couple of beers and everything is supposed to be all right. You could do that, but it's not going to make a difference.

Helen Keller said, "Walking with friends in the dark is better than walking alone in the light." Everybody in this room that's a First Responder has experienced the same thing. It's part of human nature. And I solely believe that Firefighters, Police Officers, EMTs, I believe they are ordained of God because it's not normal to do what you do.

So maybe it's time to take control of our thoughts and our mind because it's our mind that kills us. It's our mind that kills us, not the job. It's the mind that kills us.

In about two minutes I'm going to give you what I call frontline strategies: Fortitude, listen closely, fortitude, the strength of mind that enables one to encounter danger or bear pain or adversity with faith and courage. If you don't have a God that you can reach out to, I want to introduce you to one. He's there to help you. And when you cry out, you say, "Oh, God, what am I facing?" He sees.

Number two: Resistant, a burning desire to prevent something from happening and not affected or harmed by it. We got to do our job and we can't allow it to hurt us and harm us. So we need to be resistant.

Resilient: The ability to become strong, healthy or successful again after something bad happens, to be able to bounce back. Sometimes you get home and you got the next call, and the next call, and the next call, and you don't get a chance to bounce back. So resilience is very, very important.

And then we must be relentless, the ability to continue on without becoming weak, discouraged with a never-give-up attitude.

And lastly, discipline. A willingness to follow all rules, guidelines, regardless of the consequences, and know that you've done your very, very best. And sometimes your very best may be your last. And that's why we gather together today so solemnly.

I don't know about you, but when those bagpipes started, I choked up. They are beautiful, but I got to admit, if I don't have to hear them, it's okay.

So in conclusion, where do we go from here? Admit that we have a need and admit that we need to take care of that hidden baggage that we have. We call it ventilate and validate, where you sit down and talk about it.

I recently was with an agency that just had a critical incident. At the end of the session, one of the Firefighters, you know, he said, "When I came to this debriefing, I thought if I talked that I would be tagged the department bitch, the cry baby." Maybe there are others that think like that.

But you got guys and gals on the sidelines like us who are willing to reach out to you. You saw our banner out there, Alpha C-I-S-M. We have over one hundred EMTs, Firefighters, Law Enforcement, mental health people that will help you to process this, what you are going through.

So I leave those three words to you "Never, never give up."

And for those who have served and died and for the families who have made a decision to tragically end their own life, we pray for those families. We don't talk about it, but what do you say we try to prevent it by allowing ourselves to be honest and say, hey, this job is more than I can handle in my head. I need somebody that I can talk to, and I need a God who will be there when my life is in danger.

Thank you. God bless you.

The Governor has signed one (1) firematic bill into law since our last convention: S-2061 signed 08/18/16 Chap 26 P.L. 2016 – Increases accidental death benefit to 70% of final compensation for surviving children of SPRS and PFRS member; redefines children in SPRS.

Notes to Financial Statements (Modified Cash Basis) June 30, 2016 and 2015

#### 1. Organization

New Jersey State Firemen's Association (the "Association") is a not-for-profit corporation that was established through New Jersey State legislation. Its expressed purpose is to maintain a General Relief Fund that provides burial benefits to qualifying members. The Special Relief Fund was initiated to allow relief to be paid to those applicants of associations that cannot afford to satisfy the needs of an applicant when a major loss occurs due to illness or other incidents. The initial contribution of \$2,468,467 was made May 15, 2003. Benefits were made available beginning January 1, 2004.

#### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements are prepared on the cash basis, modified for capitalization of real estate held for sale, investments, which are stated at cost and certain liabilities related to insurance claims. Consequently, revenue is recognized when received rather than when earned and expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligations are incurred. The Association follows the policy of charging directly to operating expenses disbursements for furniture and equipment. In anticipation of moving into the new building, the Association is capitalizing all costs related to the building. Management has determined that the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("US GAAP"), as described above is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances.

#### Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash held in banks and money market funds with maturities of three months or less at the time of purchase.

#### Property and Equipment

Property and equipment is carried at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful life of the assets when placed into service.

#### Functional Expenses

All of the Association's operating expenses are considered program services.

#### Tax Status

The Association is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)4 of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code").

Notes to Financial Statements (Modified Cash Basis) June 30, 2016 and 2015

# 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

#### Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes

The Association recognizes the effect of income tax positions only if those positions are more likely than not to be sustained. Management has determined that the Association had no uncertain tax positions that would require financial recognition or disclosure. The Association is no longer subject to examinations by the applicable taxing jurisdictions for periods prior to fiscal 2012.

#### Subsequent Events Evaluation by Management

Management has evaluated subsequent events for disclosure and/or recognition in the financial statements through the date that financial statements were available to be issued, which date is September 15, 2016.

#### 3. Investments

Investments are carried at cost regardless of fair value at the end of the year. Gains and losses on investments are recorded upon disposition of the investment rather than providing for such gains and losses as they occur.

#### 5. Retirement Plan

Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 2015 and 2014

#### 1. Plan Description

The following brief description of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association Employees' Retirement Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information. The Plan is a defined benefit pension plan.

The Plan is administered by the New Jersey State Firemen's Association (the "Association"). The Custodian of the Plan is Riker Associates, Inc. ("Riker"). The Association has appointed Riker to hold investment assets and perform most administrative duties.

#### Pension Benefits

Employees are eligible for participation in the Plan after the completion of the later of the date the employee attains age 21 or completes six months of service. Participants become fully vested in the Plan after 5 years of service. However, 10 years of service is required for early retirement benefits.

Benefits for participants retiring upon reaching the normal retirement age of 65 are based on 65% of the average annual compensation reduced pro-rata for years less than 25, based on the previous 12 month period. The Plan also provides a cost of living adjustment.

An employee may elect early retirement after having reached age 55 and having completed 10 years of service. Benefits upon election of early retirement are reduced for each month by which the retirement date precedes age 65.

The normal form of benefit payment is a life annuity with 10 years certain for single employees and a joint and survivorship annuity basis for married employees. Several other options in the method of benefit payment are also available.

Participants who have attained the age of  $70\frac{1}{2}$  and are still working must commence collection of their pension benefits. In addition, participants will be able to accrue benefits for service beyond the age of 65.

#### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### **Basis of Presentation**

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("US GAAP"). The Plan is not required to make certain Department of Labor required disclosures as the number of eligible participants is below 100.

Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 2015 and 2014

#### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with US GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets, liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities, and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### Fair Value Measurements

The Plan follows US GAAP guidance on Fair Value Measurements which defines fair value and establishes a fair value hierarchy organized into three levels based upon the input assumptions used in pricing assets. Level 1 inputs have the highest reliability and are related to assets with unadjusted quoted prices in active markets. Level 2 inputs relate to assets with other than quoted prices in active markets which may include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities or other inputs which can be corroborated by observable market data. Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs and are used to the extent that observable inputs do not exist.

#### Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Fair value of investments in shares of mutual funds are valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset values of shares held by the Plan at year end. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Gains or losses on sales of investments are based on the average cost of investments. The change in net unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of investments is recognized as income or loss in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

#### Accumulated Plan Benefits

Accumulated plan benefits are those estimated future periodic payments that are attributable under the Plan's provisions to services rendered by the employees at the valuation date. Accumulated plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to present employees or their beneficiaries. Benefits for retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries are based on Plan provisions at the time of retirement.

Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 2015 and 2014

#### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

#### Administrative and Investment Expense

Administrative and investment expenses are paid by the Plan.

#### Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded upon distribution.

#### **Risks and Uncertainties**

The assets of the Plan are primarily financial instruments which are monetary in nature. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonable to expect the changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect amounts in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Plan contributions are made and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in theses estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

#### Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes

Management has determined that the Plan had no uncertain tax positions that would require financial statement recognition or disclosure. The Plan is no longer subject to examinations by the applicable taxing jurisdictions for the periods prior to 2012.

#### Subsequent Events Evaluation by Management

Management has evaluated subsequent events for disclosure and/or recognition in the financial statements through the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, which date is September 15, 2016.

As of and for the years ended December 31, 2015 and 2014 all of the Plan's investments, bought, sold and held were Level 1 investments.

#### 4. Actuarial Information

Accumulated plan benefits are those future periodic payments that are attributable under the Plan's provisions to the service employees have rendered. They include benefits expected to be paid to (a) retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries, (b) beneficiaries of employees who have died, and (c) present employees or their beneficiaries. The accumulated plan benefits for active employees are based on 65% of the average annual compensation reduced pro-rata for years less than 25, based on the previous 12 month period. Benefits payable under all circumstances including retirement, death, disability and termination of employment are included to the extent they are deemed attributable to employee services rendered to the valuation date.

The actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits is determined by the Association's actuary, and is that amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to adjust the accumulated plan benefits to reflect the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as for death, disability, withdrawal or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment. The significant actuarial assumptions used in the valuations as of January 1, 2015 and 2014 were (a) life expectancy of participants (the 1984 UP mortality table), (b) an assumed retirement of the earlier of age 55 and 10 years of service or age 65 and five years of service and (c) an assumed average rate of return of 6.00%.

The foregoing actuarial assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. Were the Plan to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits.

#### 5. Funding Policy

The Association's policy is to fund the Plan annually at the minimum level permitted under ERISA regulations as computed by the Association's actuary.

#### 6. Income Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the plan administrator by a letter dated March 10, 2004, that the Plan and related trust were designed in accordance with the applicable regulations of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. The plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

#### 7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Association has the right to terminate, discontinue making contributions to, amend or modify the Plan at any time, acting through written resolution of the controlling entity of the Plan. Upon termination of the Plan, participants will become fully vested in their benefits earned to date.

# NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared utilizing the cash basis of accounting which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The presented cash basis of accounting is the required method prescribed by the New Jersey Department of Human Services.

## **Nature of Business**

The New Jersey Firemen's Home is located in Boonton, New Jersey. Nursing and residential care are provided to aged and indigent firemen who have served as a member of a New Jersey fire department for a minimum of one year.

## **Cash and Cash Equivalents**

For the purpose of the statements of cash receipts and disbursements, management has defined cash and cash equivalents to be highly liquid investments, which include cash, certificates of deposit, and money market funds.

#### Estimates

Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing the statement of cash receipts and disbursements. These estimates and assumptions affect the disclosures relating to the Pension Plan. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

## **Income Taxes**

The New Jersey Firemen's Home is exempt from federal income taxes under section 501 of the Internal Revenue Code. It was incorporated as a non-profit organization under the laws of the State of New Jersey.

#### Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 2, 2016 and August 31, 2015, which are the dates the statements of cash receipts and disbursements were issued.

## NOTE 3: PENSION PLAN

The New Jersey Firemen's Home has a Pension Plan covering substantially all of its managers. The total Pension Plan expenses disbursed during the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015 was \$250,000 and \$279,856, respectively. The organization makes annual contributions to the plan as determined by the organization's finance committee. Effective July 1, 2000 all staff employees are covered under the New Jersey Public Employees Retirement System and do not accrue any further benefits under this plan. Total employee contributions disbursed during the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015 to the New Jersey Public Retirement System were \$407,340 and \$383,633. A comparison of accumulated plan benefits and plan net assets at the most recent valuation dates, July 1, 2016 and 2015 are presented below:

# NOTE 4: RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The New Jersey Firemen's Home Medical Fund transferred a net \$2,341 and \$2,129 to the Operating Fund in the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015. Investment fees and bank charges were included in the net transfers. Net transfers to the New Jersey Firemen's Home Property Fund of \$444,193 and \$249,884 were made in the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015. Expenditures for these additions were made by the Operating Fund and recorded as interfund transfers. Administrative expenses (consisting primarily of accounting, auditing and actuarial services) of \$24,043 and \$19,926 were paid by the Operating Fund on behalf of the Pension Plan in the years ended June 30, 2016.

# NOTE 5: CONCENTRATIONS

The primary source of support is the grant of \$8,358,000 received from the New Jersey State Firemen's Association (Title 54.18-8), which is the budget request for the year ended June 30, 2017. This amount represents 91% of total support. The budget request for fiscal year ended June 30, 2016 was \$8,301,320, which was received in fiscal year ended June 30, 2015 and represented 91% of total support.

# NOTE 6: COMMITMENTS

Effective August 15, 2005, the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into a three year food services management agreement with Unidine Corporation, whereby Unidine Corporation will provide the food, preparation and service, including therapeutic diets for residents, staff, employees and authorized visitors. The initial term was for a three year period, and will renew for one year periods, unless terminated in writing. The cost is based on a daily rate (\$28.54 as of August 22, 2011, the most recent renewal date), and a minimum of 29,120 resident days. Total food service cost relative to this agreement was \$951,271 and \$879,044 for the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015.

Effective October 17, 2006, the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into an agreement with Healthcare Services Group Inc. (Healthcare) whereby Healthcare will provide all necessary management, supervision, labor and materials to perform housekeeping and laundry services on the premises of the New Jersey Firemen's Home. The New Jersey Firemen's Home will retain responsibility for definitive management of all Healthcare personnel performing under this agreement. All existing housekeeping equipment will be absorbed and utilized by Healthcare in performing its duties. Any repair of, replacement of, or addition to housekeeping equipment will be the responsibility of the New Jersey Firemen's Home. The value and utilization of the existing housekeeping equipment in determining the service price.

The New Jersey Firemen's Home will pay Healthcare monthly payments of \$31,417. The term of service began on October 17, 2006, and will continue unless cancelled by either party, with 90 days written notice. Healthcare must be paid in full on the date of termination.

Total expense relative to this agreement was \$385,774 and \$380,368 for the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015.

On June 28, 2013 the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into a three year agreement with eHealth Solutions Inc., *d/b/a* SigmaCare, whereby SigmaCare will provide a comprehensive Medical Software package allowing the New Jersey Firemen's Home to serve its guests' medical needs with greater efficiency and requires a minimum monthly payment of \$1,621. This agreement will continue with successive one year periods unless either party provides a written termination letter with a 120 day notice. Total expense relative to this agreement was \$19,550 and \$20,168 for the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015. Future minimum lease payments are as follows:

# NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

## **Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared utilizing the cash basis of accounting which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The presented cash basis of accounting is the required method prescribed by the New Jersey Department of Human Services.

# **Nature of Business**

The New Jersey Firemen's Home is located in Boonton, New Jersey. Nursing and residential care are provided to aged and indigent firemen who have served as a member of a New Jersey fire department for a minimum of one year.

#### **Cash and Cash Equivalents**

For the purpose of the statements of assets, liabilities and fund balance – cash basis, management has defined cash and cash equivalents to be highly liquid investments, which include cash, certificates of deposit, and money market funds.

#### **Medical Fund**

The medical fund has been established to collect and disburse funds on behalf of the guests. An individual medical account is maintained for each guest in the New Jersey Firemen's Home. The funds are not segregated and interest earned on such funds is retained by the New Jersey Firemen's Home. The individual accounts are maintained to record the funds collected and disbursed on behalf of the guests.

The primary sources of funds collected on behalf of the guests include: Social Security benefits, pensions, health insurance reimbursements and personal remittances from guests' families. The primary sources of funds disbursed on behalf of the guests include: room and board charges, medical expenses and various personal expenses. Statements are mailed to guests' families/responsible parties on a quarterly basis. When a receivable has resulted, i.e. more funds disbursed than available, the families/responsible parties are requested to remit such.

Upon admission, guests are requested to grant the New Jersey Firemen's Home a limited power of attorney to execute the aforementioned transactions. Upon the expiration or discharge of a guest, any remaining balance is returned to the guest or the guest's estate after all anticipated expenses have been paid. Such release of funds is approved by the Board of Managers. Should a deceased guest have a balance in excess of \$500 upon death, a statement which lists the executor is required from the local county surrogate.

#### **Fixed Assets**

Fixed assets are maintained in the Property Fund. Asset acquisitions with a cost of \$1,000 or more have been capitalized. Depreciation is computed on a straight line basis over the useful lives of the assets generally as follows:

Expenditures for major renewals and betterments that extend the useful lives of property and equipment are capitalized. Expenditures for maintenance and repairs are charged to expense as paid.

#### Estimates

Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing the financial statements. These estimates and assumptions affect the disclosures relating to the Pension Plan. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### **Income Taxes**

The New Jersey Firemen's Home is exempt from federal income taxes under section 501 of the Internal Revenue Code. It was incorporated as a non-profit organization under the laws of the State of New Jersey.

#### Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 2, 2016 and August 31, 2015, which are the dates the financial statements were issued.

# NOTE 3: GUEST TRUST FUNDS RECEIVABLE

Consists of medical accounts of individual guests for which more funds have been disbursed than are available. Five guests had a combined balance of \$20,452 and \$20,419 at June 30, 2016 and 2015, which is greater than 43% and 42% of the totals.

# NOTE 4: GUEST TRUST FUNDS PAYABLE

Consists of medical accounts of individual guests for which more funds have been collected than have been disbursed. Five guests had a combined balance of \$50,016 and \$33,850 at June 30, 2016 and 2015, which is greater than 52% and 55% of the totals.

# NOTE 5: INDIGENT GUEST EXPENSES

Consists of medical accounts of former guests which had balances due to (from) the New Jersey Firemen's Home at the time of discharge/expiration. These accounts are deemed uncollectible by the Board of Managers and were written off for the year ended June 30, 2015.

# NOTE 6: PENSION PLAN

The New Jersey Firemen's Home has a Pension Plan covering substantially all of its managers. The total Pension Plan expenses disbursed during the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015 was \$250,000 and \$279,856, respectively. The organization makes annual contributions to the plan as determined by the organization's finance committee. Effective July 1, 2000 all staff employees are covered under the New Jersey Public Employees Retirement System and do not accrue any further benefits under this plan. Total employer contributions disbursed during the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015 to the New Jersey Public Retirement System were \$407,340 and \$383,633. A comparison of accumulated plan benefits and plan net assets at the most recent valuation dates, July 1, 2016 and 2015 are presented below:

## NOTE 7: RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The New Jersey Firemen's Home Medical Fund transferred a net \$2,341 and \$2,129 to the Operating Fund in the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015. Investment fees and bank charges were included in the net transfers. Net transfers to the New Jersey Firemen's Home Property Fund of \$444,193 and \$249.884 were made in the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015. Expenditures for these additions were made by the Operating Fund and recorded as interfund transfers. Administrative expenses (consisting primarily of accounting, auditing and actuarial services) of \$24,043 and \$19,926 were paid by the Operating Fund on behalf of the Pension Plan in the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015.

# NOTE 8: CONCENTRATION

The primary source of support is the grant of \$8,358,000 received from the New Jersey State Firemen's Association (Title 54.18-8), which is the budget request for the year ended June 30, 2017. This amount represents 91% of total support. The budget request for fiscal year ended June 30, 2016 was \$8,301,320, which was received in fiscal year ended June 30, 2015 and represented 91% of total support.

#### NOTE 9: COMMITMENTS

Effective August 15, 2005, the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into a three year food services management agreement with Unidine Corporation, whereby Unidine Corporation will provide the food, preparation and service, including therapeutic diets for residents, staff, employees and authorized visitors. The initial term was for a three year period, and will renew for one year periods, unless terminated in writing. The cost is based on a daily rate (\$28.54 as of August 22, 2011, the most recent renewal date), and a minimum of 29,120 resident days. Total food service cost relative to this agreement was \$951,271 and \$879,044 for the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015.

Effective October 17, 2006, the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into an agreement with Healthcare Services Group Inc. (Healthcare) whereby Healthcare will provide all necessary management, supervision, labor and materials to perform housekeeping and laundry services on the premises of the New Jersey Firemen's Home. The New Jersey Firemen's Home will retain responsibility for definitive management of all Healthcare personnel performing under this agreement. All existing housekeeping equipment will be absorbed and utilized by Healthcare in performing its duties. Any repair of, replacement of, or addition to housekeeping equipment will be the responsibility of the New Jersey Firemen's Home. The value and utilization of the existing housekeeping equipment in determining the service price.

The New Jersey Firemen's Home will pay Healthcare monthly payments of \$31,417. The term of service began on October 17, 2006, and will continue unless cancelled by either party, with 90 days written notice. Healthcare must be paid in full on the date of termination.

Total expense relative to this agreement was \$385,774 and \$380,368 for the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015.

On June 28, 2013 the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into a three year agreement with eHealth Solutions Inc., d/b/a SigmaCare, whereby SigmaCare will provide a comprehensive Medical Software package allowing the New Jersey Firemen's Home to serve its guests' medical needs with greater efficiency and requires a monthly payment of \$1,621. This agreement will continue with successive one year periods unless either party provides a written termination letter with a 120 day notice. Total expense relative to this agreement was \$19,550 and \$20,168 for the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015. Future minimum lease payments are as follows:

#### NOTE 1: Description of Plan

The following brief description of the New Jersey Firemen's Home Employees' Pension Plan is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

#### General

The Plan is a defined benefit pension. All non-union employees entered the plan on the July 1<sup>st</sup> nearest later of the last day of their first year of service and age 21. Effective July 1, 1998, only those employees who completed at least 1,000 hours of service in a plan year accrued pension benefits. Effective July 1, 1999, members of the Board of Managers are credited with 83 1/3 hours for each month they serve on the Board. Effective July 1, 2000, all staff employees are covered under the New Jersey Public Employees Retirement System and will not accrue any further benefits under this Plan.

#### Pension Protection Act of 2006

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 (PPA) was signed into law on August 17, 2006 and is generally effective for Plan Years beginning after 2007. PPA amended the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) under which increased responsibility had been placed on the Plan's Enrolled Actuary and the selection of the actuarial assumptions. In an attempt to strengthen the financial stability of all defined benefit plans, PPA substantially changed the way funding requirements are determined. The Worker, Retiree and Employer Recovery Act of 2008, which was signed into law on December 23, 2008, included technical corrections to PPA. The Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Act (MAP-21) was signed into law on July 6, 2012. The Highway and Transportation Funding Funding Relief provisions.

The actuarial cost method (funding method) to be used to determine the Minimum Required Contribution under PPA is an unprojected unit credit cost method.

PPA prescribes the use of segment interest rates for determining the present value of benefits. These segment rates are based on the corporate bond yield curve for certain investment grade bonds that mature at three different times (less than 5 years, between 5 and 20 years, and after 20 years). Alternatively, a full yield curve can be used, if elected. PPA added the calculation of an Effective Rate which is the equivalent single rate that will produce the same accrued liability (the Funding Target) as the segment rates used for funding. PPA further prescribes the use of specific mortality tables which will be published periodically by the Secretary of the Treasury.

MAP-21 changed the method of calculating the segment interest rates resulting in a reduction in Plan liabilities and minimum required contribution. Beginning with the 2008 actuarial valuation, the prescribed assumptions will be reflected, where applicable, and revised each year.

The balance of the actuarial assumptions will continue to reasonably reflect the Plan's experience. As part of the annual report to the Internal Revenue Service, the Plan's Enrolled Actuary must prepare an "actuarial statement" which includes an opinion that these nonprescribed actuarial assumptions reasonably reflect the Plan's experience and expectations and represent the "best estimate" of anticipated experience under the Plan. No changes, other than those prescribed by law, are required at this time.

# NOTE 1 (Continued)

## **Pension Benefits**

Participants with three or more years of participation were previously entitled to annual pension benefits beginning at normal retirement age (65) equal to \$16.67 multiplied by benefit years, not to exceed 30 benefit years, to a maximum of \$500 per month and a minimum of \$100 provided they had 10 or more benefit years. Effective July 1, 2002, a participant's normal pension benefit shall provide a monthly payment equal to \$83.33 multiplied by his benefit years up to, but not exceeding 10 benefit years, to a maximum of \$833.33. The Plan permits early retirement at age 55 with a minimum of 10 years of service. Participants may elect to receive their pension benefits in the form of a joint and survivor annuity. If participants terminate before rendering 5 years of service, they forfeit the right to receive the portion of their accumulated plan benefits. Effective July 1, 2005, normal retirement date has been amended to be the first of the month after the age 62 (from 65) and the later completion of three years of plan participation.

# **Death Benefits**

If a participant dies before benefits commence, but after the interest in the Accrued Benefit has become vested to some extent, his/her Spouse shall receive the survivor annuity benefit which would have been payable if the participant had elected to receive the Standard Annuity commencing the day before death, or, if the participant had not yet reached the earliest retirement age under the Plan, the benefit which would have been payable based on the actual Accrued Benefit but assuming that the participant had survived to the earliest retirement age under the Plan, had elected to receive the Standard Annuity, and had died on the following day, subject to the same actuarial reduction normally applicable on account of the commencement of benefits before the Normal Retirement Date. The Administrator may pay the Spouse, in lieu of monthly payments, a lump sum which is the Actuarial Equivalent of the survivor annuity, provided the lump sum is less than \$5,000.

If the participant dies before benefits commence while in active service, but after Normal Retirement Date, the Spouse, if any, shall receive the survivor annuity benefit which would have been payable assuming that the participant had elected to receive the Standard Annuity, and had died on the following day.

If the participant dies after benefits commence, any remaining benefits under the Standard Annuity or the alternative benefit form, if any, that was elected shall be paid to the Spouse or other Beneficiary, as the case may be.

#### **Disability Benefits**

If Service is terminated by Disability, the participant shall be eligible to receive a Disability Pension Benefit. The Disability Pension Benefit shall provide monthly payments of an amount such that the benefit is the Actuarial Equivalent of the Accrued Benefit at termination. If the participant is disabled, he/she may not elect to receive an alternative form of benefit other that the Standard Annuity. Disability Pension Benefits shall begin on the first day of the month following the fifth full calendar month of Disability, and shall end only if Disability ends before the Normal Retirement date. A participant will not be considered disabled unless he/she qualifies for disability benefits under the Federal Social Security Act or Veterans Disability Act.

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# NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

## Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

#### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by its investment advisers and custodian. See note 6 for a discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

#### **Actuarial Present Value of Accumulated Plan Benefits**

Accumulated plan benefits are those future periodic payments, including lump sum distributions, that are attributable under the plan's provisions to the service participants have rendered. Accumulated plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to (a) retired or terminated participants or their beneficiaries, (b) beneficiaries of participants who have died, and (c) present participants or their beneficiaries. Effective July 1, 2002, benefits under the plan are based on participants' benefit years multiplied by \$83.33 per year not to exceed \$833.33 per month. The benefits payable under all circumstances - retirement, death, disability, and termination of employment - are included, to the extent they are deemed attributable to participant service rendered to the valuation date.

The actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits is determined by an actuary from BPAS Actuarial and Pension Services, LLC, and is that amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to adjust the accumulated plan benefits to reflect the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as for death, disability, withdrawal or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

The foregoing actuarial assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. Were the Plan to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits.

# **Payment of Benefits**

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

# Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 2, 2016, which is the date the financial statements were issued.

#### NOTE 3: FUNDING POLICY

The New Jersey Firemen's Home's funding policy is to make annual contributions to the Plan in amounts that are usually within the minimum required contribution and maximum recommended contribution as computed by BPAS Actuarial and Pension Services, LLC. The minimum required contributions were \$73,076 and \$96,172 for years beginning July 1, 2015 and 2014. The Finance Committee of the Plan sponsor elected to contribute \$250,000 and \$279,856 in plan years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015.

# NOTE 4: PLAN TERMINATION

In the event the Plan terminates, the net assets of the Plan will be allocated, as prescribed by ERISA and its related regulations, generally to provide the following benefits in the order indicated:

- Benefits former participants or their beneficiaries have been receiving for at least three years, or that
  employees eligible to retire for that three-year period would have been receiving if they had retired
  with benefits in the normal form of annuity under the Plan. The priority amount is limited to the
  lowest benefit that was payable or would have been payable under plan provisions in effect at any
  time during the five years preceding plan termination.
- Other vested benefits insured by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (PBGC) (a U.S. governmental agency) up to the applicable limitations (discussed below).
- All other vested benefits (that is, vested benefits not insured by the PBGC).
- All nonvested benefits.

Certain benefits under the Plan are insured by the PBGC if the Plan terminates. Generally, the PBGC guarantees most vested normal age retirement benefits, early retirement benefits, and certain disability and survivor's pensions. However, the PBGC does not guarantee all types of benefits under the Plan, and the amount of benefit protection is subject to certain limitations. Vested benefits under the Plan are guaranteed at the level in effect on the date of the Plan's termination. However, there is a statutory ceiling on the amount of an individual's monthly benefit that the PBGC guarantees. That ceiling applies to those pensioners who elect to receive their benefits in the form of a single-life annuity and are at least 65 years old at the time of retirement or plan termination (whichever comes later). For younger annuits, the corresponding ceilings are actuarially adjusted downward.

Whether all participants receive their benefits should the Plan terminate at some future time will depend on the sufficiency, at that time, of the Plan's net assets to provide those benefits and may also depend on the level of benefits guaranteed by the PBGC.

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs other than quoted market prices included in Level 1 that are either directly or indirectly observable for the asset, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs are only used when level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available.

#### Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of certificates of deposit, mutual funds, corporate bonds, and money market funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year end.

#### Level 2 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of corporate bonds is based on quoted prices for similar assets in active markets.

### NOTE 7: TAX STATUS

The plan obtained its latest determination letter on July 2, 2012, in which the Internal Revenue Service states that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue code (IRC). The Plan has not been amended since receiving the determination letter.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2012.

#### NOTE 8: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Plan contributions are made and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

### NOTE 9: ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES/RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Operating Fund of the New Jersey Firemen's Home. For plan years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015 those expenses, consisting primarily of fees paid to actuaries and auditors, were \$24,043 and \$19,926, respectively.

MR. DE LAURENTIS: Good morning, Chiefs Delegates, Alternates, Life Members, Clergy, Officers of the State Association, invited guests, fellow Firefighters of the great State of New Jersey and the Guests of the Home.

Today we deliver our annual report on the affairs of the New Jersey Firemen's Home in Boonton, New Jersey for the fiscal year June 1, 2015 to June 31st, 2016.

At this time, we have 65 Guests in long-term care and 7 Guests in residential for a total of 72 Guests. This past year we admitted 25 Guests and 25 Guests answered their last alarm.

To be eligible to become a Guest at the Home, you must have been a Member in good standing for one full year of a city or municipal recognized Fire Department or Fire Company. You do not have to be a Member of the Local Relief Association.

The Home is able to accommodate both men and women Firefighters, you just must meet the terms and conditions for admission. The monthly fee for the Guests continues to be \$850 and no application has ever been denied admittance due to financial reasons.

We held our annual Memorial Service to honor the Guests at the Home who answered their final alarm on July 11, 2016, with family and friends invited. The Memorial Service was telecast in-house on channel 40.

Throughout the year the Home holds barbecues and picnics outside for the Guests. Several of the Guests attended the Giants/Patriots football game, continue to hold Thanksgiving dinners for the Guests and they can invite two guests.

This year we began a horticultural therapy for our Guests.

We partnered with Berkeley College allowing student nurses to be part of their clinical work here at the Home.

The Northern Chapter of the F.M.B.A. donated a wheelchair, gliding swing set, and the concrete pad for it.

Some of the major improvements this year were: We replaced the HV/AC roof top units for the auditorium; new generator has been ordered and is planned to be installed in October 2016; replacing our Bilco doors; updated the electrical services and working on the administration building.

At this time, I'd like to read a letter first:

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Thank you, Mr. Secretary.

The results are not up yet. We will go into unfinished business.

We will go into new business.

Before we go into the microphones, I have two presentations. The first gentleman, Sanford I. Weinberg was accepted into the New Jersey State Firemen's Association December 1960 as a Firefighter for Engine Company No. 1 of the Verona Fire Department. He served on the Board of Managers from November 1999 to September 2000. He was appointed Secretary to the N.J.S.F.A. in November 2000 and served as Secretary till he retired on September 2015.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: It says, "Presented to Sanford I. Weinberg for his outstanding and dedicated service as State Secretary, October 2000 through September 2015, Board of Managers from the County of Essex October 1999 to September 2000, the New Jersey State Firemen's Association September 17th, 2016."

Sandy, congratulations.

MR. WEINBERG: Thank you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: You are welcome.

Mr. Stauffer, couldn't be with us today. Chief Darren Rivers of the Jersey City Fire Department will accept his award:

"Joseph D. Stauffer was accepted into the New Jersey State Firemen's Association as a Member in April 1959 as a Firefighter for Jersey City Fire Department.

Joe was elected Executive Committeeman to represent the Career Fire Departments in Hudson County in December 1986 until December 1988. He was appointed Secretary January '89 to September 1994. He was elected again to Executive Committeeman in February of 2006 until his resignation in September 2016."

"Presented to Joseph D. Stauffer for his outstanding and dedicated service as State Secretary," which I read through, "presented New Jersey State Firemen's Association September 17, 2016."

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Mr. Wright, step forward, please.

MR. WRIGHT: Mr. President, Officers and Executive Committeemen, Life Members, Delegates, invited guests, the Alternates and everybody that is here, I'm sorry I'm a little bit late here, but we are trying to get this as near to accurate as we possibly can. So with that said, and I do want to add something to this: I want to thank my committee, the Credentials Committee. The fellows have been with me now for the last few years, they do a super job for us. And the unsung heroes are the girls in the Office. If anybody has ever called the Office and needed information, they are the girls that do a terrific job and I think they deserve one big applause because they do a super job.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

MR. WRIGHT: Thank you.

And for Saturday's roll call we have Life Members of 4,421; Delegates: 2,243; Alternates: 103; Grand total 6,767. Life Members: 4,421; Delegates: 2,243; Alternates: 103; Total: 6,767. And that was as of just a few minutes ago. So, hopefully, it's close. Thank you. Thank you, very much. PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Thank you, Charlie. Registration is now closed. While we are waiting for the results, we will go into new business.

Anyone like to speak?

Microphone number six.

MR. KEYSER: Mr. President, Members of the Executive Committee, my name is Gary Keyser, Life Member, Hanover Township Relief Association.

Yesterday we heard from the Vice President of – Rich Mikutsky from the Career Fire Chiefs, we heard from our Lieutenant Governor yesterday. And I have to believe that Mr. Mikutsky for what he said for his position, his last words he said, the Career and Volunteer Members need to work together to get things done.

I have to give the man respect because he comes from a combination Department, Career and Volunteer, so we should reach out to him whenever we need something.

The Lieutenant Governor, she also spoke about retention and recruitment of LOSAP to retain and try to recruit Members for our Organization.

But we have another problem that needs to be addressed and hopefully you can, the Association can address this. And I'm talking about our older Volunteer Firemen. People have been in the service for 50, 60, 70 years, they are at an age where they can't live in New Jersey. They have been married for numerous years and they don't want to leave their loved ones. Why can't we try to put something in the New Jersey State Firemen's Home where husband and wife can live and be taken care of for all the money that the Volunteers saved in that 60 years of service. That's something that should be looked at.

The other thing is our younger Members, every community has a program of affordable housing. Our younger Members are coming in, they are going to school, they are getting their training, but they can't live in the community or the towns that they are volunteering in. Somewhere we need to put something into our affordable housing laws; a third of housing that comes up in your community should be dedicated for the Volunteer Fire and EMS service people that protect that community and saves the tax dollars for that community.

Thank you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Thank you.

Your words are well taken and we will look into that.

Microphone number one.

MR. HANKINS: Thank you, Mr. President.

Joseph Hankins, Life Member, Manchester Firemen's Relief Association and also Executive Committeeman, Ocean County.

I'd like to take this time to thank the Members who worked on the Health Care Assistance Program, especially President Heflich and Vice President Gunson for putting the committee together. Other Members that served on the committee were Secretary Kevin Finnegan, Jake Genovay, Gerry Naylis, Field Examiner Kenny, I chaired it, Warren County, Konnie Mellert; Monmouth County, Bob Kelly; Cumberland County, James Reeves; and Passaic County, John Lane.

All these Executive Committeemen and Officers spent a lot of time and effort putting together this Health Care Assistance Program that I hope everyone can use.

And the gentleman who just spoke, that may help with the older Firemen as well, that's who it was designed for.

I just wanted to say thank you to all the committee members. I know people took vacation days from work to attend these meetings and it was important.

And it's my understanding the committee will stand with newly-appointed committee members Andy Mazzarella from Middlesex and Cindy Badger from Atlantic to assist the Advisory Board.

So thank you again, everyone.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Thank you, Joe.

So everybody in this room can take advantage of that program, it doesn't have to be up in age. So it's there.

New information will be sent out the first week in October to every Association.

Microphone six.

MR. SIGNORELLO: Joseph Signorello, Jr., Fire Chief, Roselle Park, Life Member.

This is my 35th year at the Convention.

We need to do something about voting. You said about spending money yesterday. Buy some real voting machines or rent them like the counties use. And maybe put a voting machine next to a computer.

I think the guys were very respectful this morning what happened. You could have had a major problem here.

So can we think about purchasing or asking Camden County if we could rent their machines? Now when we know who is running for election, can it be done? Just like November 8th we have an election, can the same process happen here next year?

I implore the whole committee, the President down, to look into doing something different. Nothing has changed in 35 years. The line, the dot, whatever, there's a better way.

Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Thank you, Joe.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: If I get reelected, I will attend to that or the new President will take care of that problem.

Thank you.

Number six. Microphone six.

MR. RAYE: Mr. President, Steven Raye, Life Member, past President Wantage Township Relief Association, Sussex County.

Fellow Firefighters, please listen carefully: If you are a Volunteer, quietly please stand. If you are a Volunteer, quietly please stand.

Thank you.

If you truly believe that your Department is well-manned, which may indicate not having a "Members needed" message on your sign board in front of your Firehouse, you may quietly, please quietly, take your seat, and thank you.

Officers and representatives, please look at the Firefighters that are standing before you. We need help.

Fellow Firefighters, thank you, and please sit down.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Thank you for your input.

MR. RAYE: I'm not done yet.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Oh, I'm sorry.

MR. RAYE: I don't wish to be pushed away from the mic.

Each Department, each municipality or each county in New Jersey cannot tackle the desperate need for the infusion of new blood into our ranks.

We Firefighters by nature are programmed to help our neighbor and now we need help.

Of almost 37,000 Firefighters in the State of New Jersey, 30,000 are Volunteers, and the average age is 53.

It is time that a larger, stronger voice be heard.

Last year a letter from Sussex County Firemen's Association was forwarded to this Association questioning the State Association's plans to address this issue. It did not get read during the 2015 Convention.

I have been informed that it was addressed during the 2016 course of events.

In 2015 during our county caucus to this Convention and subsequent meetings, our President addressed the issue of the average age of the state Firefighters being 53. When I questioned him as to what was the State Association's plan to lower that number, I received a firm "nothing."

It is stated in the New Jersey Firefighters skill addendum that Volunteer recruitism and retention program type of assistance advisory and programatic description provides guidance, visual aids and assistance to local Volunteers and combination Fire Departments, First Aid Squads, ambulances and Rescue Squads trying to recruit new Members and retrain current Members.

This sign does not constitute much of a program. Many other states provide a statewide media program for this type of aid. Other states and communities offer tax relief, college tuition assistance, life and health benefits, insurance benefits as incentives to the Volunteer Responders. Still others have partners with the National Volunteer Fire Council for help.

At the state level, you could have the strength to lobby and redesign the training requirements in a way that would encourage new Members. Building on what the Lieutenant Governor said yesterday also, many local municipalities are not able to afford to pay for Career Fire protection. So the Volunteer is still a very needed service. We are not going away, we are just dying off.

I'm requesting the support of all my Brother Firefighters who were standing with me, that the New Jersey Firemen's Relief Association pursue statewide programs to assist the Volunteer Fire Departments recruiting the Members and retaining the Members.

Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Before you leave the microphone, sir, Second Assistant Secretary Naylis will give you a few ideas.

MR. RAYE: I understand that there was a suggestion that there may have been booths set up out in the hall as you came in; however, as I mentioned, it's better to have one stronger voice than it is to have as many voices as we have here separately.

SECOND ASSISTANT SECRETARY NAYLIS: I couldn't agree with you more.

And the fact is that this topic was discussed at an Executive Board meeting; I have been authorized by the President, along with Executive Committeeman Phillips, to begin work.

I have already begun some research because rather than go with some type of a knee-jerk reaction that would probably fall on its face, I feel that the better thing to do is to put together a comprehensive package and present it to the appropriate levels of government.

One of the things that I can tell you that we have already done is found out the information about tuition credit that's available through every community college. We have already started distributing that information. And it's amazing how many people are not aware of some of the benefits that already exist.

I have already started using some of the techniques that we have used in our own Fire Department to try and develop a recruitment program that could be implemented in any Volunteer Fire Department.

In the past year and a half, my Department was able to attract 18 new Members. Part of it is going into the school system. Part of it is dealing with your local Fire Academy.

In Bergen County, we run three Fire I classes during the summer daytime which seems to be very, very attractive to the high school students. And we are looking at other opportunities that we can give out to Fire Departments and the Fire Service throughout the state. But in order to make it work, we believe it has to be a full comprehensive program.

I've spoken already with Heather Schaefer at the N.V.F.C. to try and latch onto the things that they have developed as well so that we can address the concerns that you have raised.

And I greatly appreciate you coming to the microphone and letting the entire Convention know.

Thank you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Microphone number one.

MR. CAHILL: My name is Tony Cahill, past Chief Eagleswood Fire Company and current Secretary of Eagleswood Firemen's Relief Association.

Last year I came out here and spoke about the age restrictions to join the Association. And the typical no answer is what was given and we never proceeded any further from that.

Yesterday you sent out a mixed message: Last year you told me that the reason why we don't do this most of the time, it's because the amount of money that we stand to lose by paying out in death benefits if we raise the age.

Yesterday you told us we need to go out and we need to find people that we can give relief to.

Can you give me a straight answer?

### PRESIDENT HEFLICH: As far as what? As far as what?

MR. CAHILL: Are we going – am I going to my Association to find somebody I can give money to so that we can spend money? Or am I going to tell other Members of my Fire Company who are Volunteers, who are joining who cannot become Members of this Association based on their age, which is kind of ridiculous because they are all risking their lives in the same manner that I do, my son does, and my daughter-in-law does.

So am I to go find people to give relief to and you will approve it, just so we can spend money so it doesn't look like we have more money coming in than we are spending out?

If we are going to take a party line, let's pick one line and let's stand by it.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: What I said yesterday was our Convention expenses cannot exceed the relief given out by 538 Associations.

And as far as the age, I also repeated at our meeting in February or July, a vote was taken not to raise the age, leave it at 45, 13 to seven. That's what I said yesterday.

MR. CAHILL: I got that.

But you told me yesterday to go out and find people in my Association who need relief because we are not spending enough money. That's what I took away from what you said yesterday.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: You are correct because a lot of Associations will not look or go after their older Firefighters or their older widows who are living on fixed incomes where they could need this money. Yes, that's what I said, and that's why I said it.

MR. CAHILL: This age thing needs to be looked at and it needs to be looked at by fresh minds.

Unfortunately, the ballots have already been cast and I hope you are presiding over your last official duties.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Then, let it be, sir.

Thank you.

Microphone six.

MR. WOURNELL: Good afternoon, Executive Committee and good afternoon to all New Jersey Firefighters, Life Members and Delegates.

My name is Dean Wournell, I'm from the City of New Brunswick Firemen's Relief Association.

I felt compelled to come to the microphone here today to encourage and ask a change for next year and all the successive years.

It would seem to me that yesterday we were given the luxury of hearing the candidates that were running for office. Then we quickly got into the reading of resolutions, which were not presented in the correct order, but that's fine. I'm willing to move along with that. It was clear on the voting ballot.

My problem is, is in a democratic society, we have all saluted the flag here today, we have read the National Anthem and we sang "God Bless America.." Whether you agree with the resolution from the City of New Brunswick's Relief Association, I feel that we should have been given the opportunity to comment and encourage debate on the resolution.

So I'm asking this committee, Executive Committee and New Jersey Firefighters in the future should you have a resolution, that you would be given the opportunity to speak on your resolution.

And I'm going to take it one step further, real quickly, I don't want to hold everybody up here. I do understand with the large amount of people in the room, some of the resolutions can be quite combative and encourage a lot of talk. But maybe there should be a time limit provision on a resolution discussion.

Thank you, very much for your time this afternoon. And everybody enjoy the rest of your Convention and have a safe trip home. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Words well taken.

Microphone one.

MR. ZAZZERA: Phil Zazzera, Verona Fire Department.

In lieu of last year's voting fiasco, I think the Association deserves the right to an explanation as to why the Attorneys were rehired this year.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: I will tell you why, a vote was taken at our Executive meeting and 17 Executivemen voted to retain our Attorneys, not Officers, and three were against it. That's why they were retained.

Does that answer your question, sir?

MR. ZAZZERA: Yes, it does. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Thank you. Microphone five.

MR. FUSCO: Peter Fusco -

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: You lost it, Peter.

MR. BOWEN: Todd Bowen, Bridgeton Firemen's Relief Association.

Last year I came up and spoke after – I've been coming to the meetings for many years and never did. My question for you is if, that's if you get reelected, will you go through the practice that you did last year and track me down, find my cell phone number, call me, curse me out on my cell phone, then come to my Chiefs and Officers Association with transcripts of what I said in a vain attempt to embarrass me in front of my colleagues? Is that a procedure you will be following this year or is that done?

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Let's correct -

MR. BOWEN: I'm not the only one that you went and you talked to other people. And I want to know if that's a practice of the Association or if you personally decided to do that and go and try to embarrass these people for coming up and talking?

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: I didn't embarrass you -

MR. BOWEN: You are right. You are right. You tried to and you didn't.

I'm just asking will you be doing that again this year?

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: If you give false information to our Association and to every audience, yes, I will. You gave me false information. Mr. Weinberg did not resign he retired. And I took the Minutes verbatim what you said and you didn't like it.

MR. BOWEN: I did not give false information. I said it was crooked and ridiculous, which is my opinion. I expressed my opinion, you came and tried to embarrass me.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: You have your opinion.

MR. BOWEN: I don't think we are going to have the problem again.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Whatever.

Thank you.

Microphone six.

MR. FUSCO: Peter Fusco, Somerville, New Jersey.

I also had an issue with the Attorneys that were hired. The explanation that was given to me was that there was pending litigation and that's why they were kept on.

Well, there will always be pending litigation and no matter how poor a job they do, it's being that they will be retained. And I think if it's our duty, if they are going to be retained by the Committeemen, then it's time to get some new Committeemen.

Also, between the property, the site work and the construction of the new facility, you are probably going to spend about \$4 million. And with the depressed market that's out there right now, couldn't you have found an existing structure that would have cost less than \$4 million?

Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: You are welcome.

Microphone two.

MR. MURPHY: They would like you to answer the question and then I will talk.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Which question? The last question on our Attorneys?

Will you repeat your question, please, so I can answer it?

Okay, here's the reason why – we are not buying a new building, we bought land to build a new building.

We looked at three or four buildings in the area of Monmouth County – would you let me finish?

We looked at, at least four in one area and around the County of Monmouth. Okay? There was only one building that was -I say we could have or we might have or we could have bought that.

So we rode around and after the decision of the Executivemen at a meeting, we explained what we looked at or whatever, the suggestion was to buy property. And we bought it in Wall Township in the middle of the state, which this group wanted our Office in the middle of the state. And that's what happened.

Does that answer your question?

Microphone two.

MR. MURPHY: Mr. President, Dennis Murphy, Allendale Fire Department, Bergen County.

I spoke to you yesterday about a problem I had coming here to this Convention and you told me you were going to address it with the Mayors Association and make sure that they said something here. You also told me at that time that I was not the only one that had the problem with the tram car coming here. Ironically nothing was mentioned by the Mayors Association representative.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: It was the Mayor here, I told him of your situation.

Do I have to hold him with a gun to tell him to repeat what I told him?

MR. MURPHY: You represent every Member in this building and every Member that uses that tram car.

My watch says 12:25. There's a good chance we are not going to be out of here by one o'clock. The tram car courtesy from those bandits expires at one o'clock. Maybe somebody should inform them that all the people, especially the older Members, be given courtesy even though it will be after one o'clock when they get out of here probably to return to their hotels via the tram car.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: What you told me was eleven o'clock they should be free. How many people were refused access to the tram car after eleven o'clock? You are the only one and I gave him your complaint.

MR. MURPHY: You told me yesterday more than myself was complaining.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: No. They were complaining about the trolley on the next block over. I said only the tram was free.

MR. MURPHY: Mr. President, you told me that people complained about the trolley as well as the tram car and that people were mistaken about the trollies. That's a simple problem. Maybe you can take care of that for next year.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Okay. Thank you.

MR. MURPHY: I'm not done, sir, and I don't need a microphone to be heard.

Four or five years ago one of my Brothers or Sisters got up to one of these microphones and asked about the housing situation.

My wife, who doesn't notice an awful lot, has noticed that a lot of the same concrete areas where the mom and pop hotels were bought up, knocked down, are still sitting there. Housing is becoming a problem.

A Delegate cannot come down here comfortably in any way, shape or form. Housing is increasing all the time.

And I think this Association should petition you people that when we vote for five years from now, we wait a year and put this Mayors Association and this whole three mile island Mafia in fear, in fear that we are going to take our money someplace else in five years because it's getting pretty ridiculous.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: I'm not biting on that one.

Are you done?

MR. MURPHY: Pardon me, sir, you said something?

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: I said I'm not going to bite on that word "Mafia" is what I meant.

MR. MURPHY: Excuse me, organization, whatever you would like to call it.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: If you rode up and down Ocean Avenue in the last three nights, how many vacancy signs did you see? So there's plenty of rooms available in Wildwood. MR. MURPHY: How many vacant mom and pops have been bought up, knocked down by the bigger motels and then they are able to control the room rate to higher rates, and the mom and pops are gone, and those concrete slabs are still sitting vacant.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: I will tell you what, if I get reelected, I will get you how many small hotels are gone and how many big ones are built. How is that? Will that answer your question?

MR. MURPHY: Very few have been built.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Well, you want an amount, don't you?

MR. MURPHY: Good-bye, Frank.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: No, George. Frank is sitting next to me.

Number six.

Give me a round of applause for being right once.

I thrive on this, I guess you realize that.

Microphone six.

MAYOR TROIANO: George, Ernie Troiano, Mayor of the City of Wildwood and godfather of the Mafia.

You know, it's amazing you would sit there and listen to that. That's just ridiculous.

By the way, we are five miles not three miles.

If you could get investors to come in and build in this town, we would be more than happy.

You know, the economy for bank lending is not very good at this moment.

So, as far as the tram car, like I told you yesterday, the only guy that complained, and I called the guy who runs it, it goes to eleven o'clock, and that's because of the problems with the other traffic that comes in.

The trolleys that run on Pacific Avenue are an independent company that does what they do.

So, if you have a problem, I will be standing in the back, I don't run away, and you know what, I got a lot of capos and lieutenants that will back me up.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Mayor Troiano, thanks for bailing me out. I appreciate that.

Anything else under new business?

Okay, we still haven't got the results.

We need a selection on location for holding the Convention for year 2021 in Wildwood.

MR. SPEIGEL: Dan Speigel, City of Wildwood Fire Department, Wildwood Firemen's Relief Association.

I make a motion to hold the 2021 Convention right here in this building that the Firefighters help build, the Wildwood Convention Center.

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: All in favor?

CONVENTION BODY: (Chorus of ayes.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: All against?

Ayes have it. Very good.

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All right, we will give you the results. Either I get chased or Frank is your new President. How is that?

MR. FAZEKAS: Good afternoon.

We had a total of 5,281 votes casted.

For the position of President: Richard Vander Berg received 493 votes; Frank Gunson received 2,608 votes; George Heflich received 2,062 votes.

For the position of Vice President: Neil Gallo received 1,555 votes; Thomas Pelaia received – I'm sorry. Robert Ordway received 2,293 votes; Thomas Pelaia received 1,138 votes.

For the position of Treasurer: Barry Osborn received 4,452 votes.

For the position of Secretary: Kevin Finnegan received 4,518 votes.

First Assistant Secretary: Jacob Genovay received 4,493 votes.

Jake, I have to thank you. He pushed me over 30 years ago to get involved with the Relief Association when I was younger. We need to get our younger Members involved.

There's one gentleman up here, every President has used him as a resource, as you go to classes for transfer of knowledge. I'd like to thank President Emeritus Ernie Greenwald for all the support he has given myself and the past Presidents.

PRESIDENT-ELECT GUNSON: I'm going to save the best for last, President Heflich; Prez, George, when we came in together, he told me I was the administrator. He allowed me to get involved and be involved in everything and has helped me that when I take over, I'm better than we were nine years ago.

George, thank you and I hope you remain a friend of the Association. He has been a great asset and an ambassador for this Association.

I have two announcements before the Benediction: Firefighter Service this evening is 4:30 at St. Ann's Roman Catholic Church on Atlantic Avenue.

Sunday, October 9th is Firefighters Remembrance Day for all those Firemen killed in the Line of Duty. Please have your Fire Company display the flag of our country.

The Benediction by Reverend Robert M. Wittik, Pastor and Chaplain.

CHAPLAIN WITTIK: Thank you, Mr. President.

My wife and I are thankful to be with all of you again this year as program participants and guests of this Convention.

Allow me to share some last good words to help us properly conclude this event.

I mentioned yesterday that I was most grateful for those First Aid Squad Members that saved my life when they extricated me from the front seat of a passenger vehicle in a head-on collision on Route 7 in North Arlington. I was 16 years old at the time.

Those North Arlington First Aid Squad Members remain faceless and nameless to this day. And this largely due to the seriousness of my head injuries and weeks of hospitalization and recovery. However, I will never forget their voices, their words and their efforts that allowed me to live another day and be here now 46 years later.

The best thing for me was that I decided to stop just living for myself that day as a willful choice with a new desire to give back life and hope in the same way to others as had been offered to me by that small group of people just like you.

And it's true that some personal tragedies, though most unpleasant, result in the peaceable fruit of righteousness and concern for the well-being of others.

I learned on that day, on April 20th, 1970 that small group of North Jersey First Responders that my life matters.

And just like many of you, while I haven't received that many thank yous along the way, I have had a the confidence that it was the right thing to do, and that the God of heaven and earth was regularly taking notice because he does. And I have learned since and by example that all lives matter both to you and to God. You guys just don't discriminate in times of someone's emergency. We all learned just yesterday that the average age of New Jersey's Firefighters is 53 years of age. Those of you who are younger and willing to serve, train and certify as a First Responder and learn all you can from your elders have my heartfelt appreciation and respect. And you know why? As a College Chaplain for 16 years, I know there are more me's out there who are going to need saving.

I made a wrong choice as a teenager that day with near fatal consequences and somewhere in New Jersey so will they. And it will be up to you to help pick up the pieces to resolve the disaster before you and show them that their lives matter too.

In doing this you will reflect the character and purpose of our Lord when He said, "For the son of man did not come to destroy men's lives, but to save them."

I want that same holy spirit working in me and through me. And I trust when all is said and done, you will always want God's spirit in your life as well. But it will come at some cost and may be a very serious one, although I pray not.

As with many of you I have had 9/11 on my mind all week. The 15th anniversary hit me rather hard; death destruction and disease does not discriminate by color, gender or even age.

The eldest F.D.N.Y. Firefighter lost that day was 72, the youngest EMS responding person was 18. Nor did death respect rank. That day took a F.D.N.Y. Fire Commissioner, a Marshall, a Chaplain, a Department Chief, seven other Chiefs, 23 Captains, 44 Lieutenants and 257 regular Firefighters and 75 New York City Firehouses lost at least one Member on that fateful day. Not to mention 37 Port Authority Police Officers, 23 N.Y.P.D. Officers, eight EMTs and Paramedics and one Secret Service Agent. And, yes, many others since due to the complex physical and mental health issues that they have tried to face.

Jesus said to His disciples one day, "Go your ways, behold I send you out as lambs in the midst of wolves," from Luke, Chapter 10 Verse 3.

In a few hours, you will leave this wild, wild ocean paradise and return to active duty at your personally and professionally assigned posts, knowing deep down that currently unknown perpetrators at home and abroad are plotting and scheming new paths of destruction and terror. Thus from here we all depart as sheep among unknown and cowardly, but determined evil wolves.

As such, and speaking very personally, my wife and I will never support any persons or policies and especially programs that would place any of you unnecessarily at risk and just in their book for personal and political gain.

May honor and praise and all glory be given to our God both now and forever more. God bless our spouses and families who stand with us in our endeavors. Be blessed, God speed, stay safe as you all serve this great country and our state. God love you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Applause.)

PRESIDENT HEFLICH: Thank you. Thank you, Pastor.
