We have some guest speakers now. First, I'll call up Rich Mikutsky from the Division of Fire Safety.

MR. MIKUTSKY: Good morning, Brothers and Sisters.

President Ordway, I thank you once again for the invite and thank you for your continued cooperation as we work to make New Jersey's Fire Service safer and better

My remarks this morning are going to be kind of in the vein of the Memorial Service that we just experienced. I would like to speak, really, to an event that happened just 72 days ago, an unthinkable event, in the City of Newark.

On July 5th, the Newark Fire Department suffered every Department's worst nightmare, with a Line-of-Duty Death, the loss of two of their Brothers.

In December 1773, Benjamin Franklin wrote an essay entitled "Brave Men at Fires." He might as well have written it just a few short weeks ago. In his essay, he said "Neither cold nor darkness will deter good people from hastening to the dreadful place to quench the flames. They do it not for the sake of reward or fame, but they have a reward in themselves, and they love one another."

Like Firefighters everywhere, they embodied the best of humanity, of commitment, of community, of teamwork and trust.

These two men, on July 5th, hastened to a dreadful place to save others. For them, there was no other way. That's all they knew.

For over a hundred years in service to our nation, the U.S. Army Spartan Brigade has been tested in crucibles of ground combat. To this day, they fight America's adversaries with overwhelming combat power. When the nation calls, "Whom shall we send?" A Spartan will respond, "Send me."

When that same question rang that night from the fiery ship in Port Newark, Augusto "Augie" Acabao and Wayne "Bear" Brooks, Jr. also answered, "Send me."

They were Firefighters to the core, heroes already to their friends and loved ones. For both, being a Firefighter was more than just a job. It was in their blood. As they entered the burning ship that night, they were following their dream, to serve and to save lives.

They embodied the best of humanity, of commitment and community, of teamwork and trust; values instilled to the core and character of all of us as Firefighters, values reflected in the service we provide as Firefighters.

If the Acabou and Brooks families were here with us today, we would tell them that we can only imagine how hard it is and know how much they yearn to reach out and touch the living memories that they can see so clearly in their mind's eye; the smiles, the warmth, the Sunday dinners, the last movie they watched together. We would tell them that we hope they remember the good and happy times and that those good and happy times will bring them smiles through their tears.

To our Brothers and Sisters in Newark, your tragedy is our tragedy. Your mourning is our mourning. The Fire Service grieves with you, and we support you through this still difficult time.

As we honor "Augie" and "Bear," we pledge that they will always be in our hearts and their examples will never die.

Please be safe and enjoy the Convention. Thank you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Next, we have Wildwood Fire Chief Ernest Troiano III

CHIEF TROIANO: Good morning, everyone. I'd be the first to tell you I don't prep notes to speak, I don't shoot from the hip, but I do speak from the heart.

So, to stand up here and represent the Wildwood Department as the Chief and welcome you all back to Wildwood is truly an honor.

Born and raised in this city. Since I was a little kid, I watched the parade. This was like the greatest weekend ever, you know, especially a third-generation Firefighter. We grew up in this environment and it was absolutely phenomenal, and then just to be a part of it is just amazing.

We take great pride in providing a service to you all while you're here. If there's anything any of you need, don't hesitate to reach out to us. We're here for you. We want your experience to be the best it can be. We want a productive and safe Convention.

And as we navigate - we continue to navigate through these changing times. I mean, it's as simple as a six-hour parade, when I was a little kid, to maybe an hour. Correct? It's changed.

The Fire Service has changed, the world's changing, the political environment is garbage right now, right? Our morale is down, for the most part.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

CHIEF TROIANO: The one thing that never changes is the Fire Service. When somebody calls 911, they need us, the worst of times, during the pandemic, whatever the case may be, we show up. These people need us. They need that constant in their life. In this ever-changing world, they need that constant. They need the Fire Service. They need the professionalism; Volunteer, Career, it doesn't matter.

When they call, we always show up. And even for a brief period at the worst of their times, things are getting better and they're given a little bit – a boost of confidence knowing that there's people there that will show up for their biggest emergency, their smallest emergency, and that people actually, genuinely care about them

So, to stand up here and address you folks and welcome you back to Wildwood, is truly an honor to be a part of such a great Brotherhood. And again, I wish you all a very safe and productive Convention.

And again, if any of you need anything, we're a phone call away. You know where our headquarters is. Feel free to stop in. We love meeting new people.

God bless America, God bless our troops, God bless you all.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

CHIEF TROIANO: One last thing. Tomorrow, we will be hosting our annual 911 Memorial Stair Climb right here in Convention Center. It's not too late if anybody would like to do so.

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Chief, I'd like to present you with the trophy from the New Jersey State Firemen's Association for the best appearing overall Department in the parade tomorrow.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Next, we have Wildwood Convention Center Executive Director Louis Belasco.

MR. BELASCO: Good afternoon and welcome to the 2023 New Jersey Firemen's Convention.

I gotta tell you, it is a privilege to stand before you today and extend my warmest greetings to a gathering of the bravest men and women in the Garden State; those who voluntarily put their lives on the line to keep our communities safe.

It is an honor for the Wildwoods to continue to host this gathering of dedicated and selfless heroes, who serve our communities all hours of the day or night. We are excited to highlight our hospitality and warmth of our community throughout your stay.

As you explore our island, please enjoy some well-earned relaxation. For few understand the challenges you face every day: The long hours, the sacrifices, and the emotional toll of your work. But through it all, you remain steadfast in your commitment to serving and protecting the people of New Jersey.

For this service, on behalf of the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority and the Wildwoods Convention Center, I express our gratitude for this service through our commitment to your organization.

We are here to make your Annual Convention the best it can be now and for many years to come.

As a recognition of this service and the efforts of your Convention Committee and President, I would ask that - I would like to ask President Robert Ordway to join me for a moment.

Rob, on behalf of the Wildwoods Convention Center, I would like to present you with this token of our appreciation and to thank you for your support of the Wildwoods and congratulations on a successful year as President.

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Thank you, sir.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

MR. BELASCO: Once again, on behalf of the entire island, I extend a heartfelt welcome to the 2023 New Jersey Firemen's Convention, and thank you for entrusting us with this privilege of hosting you this year. Thank you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Our next speaker is from the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation, Joseph Minogue.

MR. MINOGUE: Good morning, everyone.

I have to say before – this is my first time in Wildwood: New Jersey, you do it right. This is pretty good. There's a great energy here and it's amazing.

I look around, and I think what the Foundation is, is a collection of people, and where – we come from all walks of life. And I'm sitting back here and I'm looking all over and everybody is wearing something different.

We all look different, but we all have the same belief. We're Firefighters, we're First Responders, and we want to give back to the community. And that's what the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation is all about.

So, on behalf of Ron Siarniki, our outgoing Executive Director, and Victor Stagnaro, our Current Chief Executive Officer, who will carry on the mission, I bring this message: The Foundation was put together by Congress to make sure that our Fallen Firefighters are honored and that their loved ones are taken care of because we pledge to never forget.

And by a sign of what's going on here and outside as they're walking in and hearing about this stair climb and the necrology of names that New Jersey has lost this year, you believe the same thing, that we will never forget.

So, if you've never heard about the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation, I ask you to stop outside at the booth and ask who we are. If you see me walking around, ask who we are.

You can go to <u>firehero.org</u>, and look up who we are and what we can do for you.

And perhaps you can help us deliver a message, that we will never forget. We will honor those that are lost that we love. And I say "love," because when you lose somebody, you don't stop loving them. They're still in your hearts.

So, if you get a chance and the opportunity, come down to Emmitsburg, Maryland in May. First weekend of May is our Memorial where we honor those who have lost their lives. This past year we honored 144 Members of the Fire Service.

Four of those Members came from New Jersey, and that's what we're here for. We're here for those that have Fallen before. And unfortunately, for what we do, we know that there will be more.

So, the Foundation was put together by Congress to honor everyone. But like a lot of things that go on in the Federal Government, the direction was given, but unfunded.

So, we grab our money from grants. Just like every Fire Service organization here applies for, we apply for grant money.

We also rely on corporate funds to help the Fire Service programs build to, A, prevent Line-of-Duty Deaths, and to keep true to our mission to take care of the families that have come before with a lost Member.

We also rely on private donations. So outside at the booth – there's some booths. If you feel like putting fifty cents in there or more, we'll be grateful.

And we also, in the Fire Service, we believe in a celebration of life. So tonight, over at the Pier, we'll have a fundraiser with the Cliff Dorsey Band. And if you like country music, he has some phenomenal – some music from Nashville to help us out. So come on down and do that.

If your Department wants to have recognition for yourselves or someone that you lost, you can participate in our Brick Program.

So then at Emmitsburg, at the Memorial, we have sidewalks, and in those sidewalks there are bricks with names of people that have lost their lives. And that project was started to honor those who have lost their lives prior to 1981.

So, if you go to <u>firehero.org</u>, take a look at the Brick Program, see if it fits for you, your organization, and participate.

So, we are a nonprofit organization and we are here to help you.

I thank you, New Jersey.

I honor the words that were said before I got up here, when honoring the training that you all do to make everybody go home safe at the end of the day, and we have that training available.

And the Chief was saying, if I believe I heard him right, you can make a difference in one person's life and that has generational effects. We know, based on our job, everybody cannot go home at the end of the day, at the end of their tour.

So, we're here to honor those and let that legacy continue. Just like the people here on the stage, and I know in your hearts, that's why you're all here.

So, thank you. I'll see you tonight. Have a great Convention.

And again, New Jersey, you do it right. Thank you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Our next speaker is Donna Buscio, Founder of the program, "A Gift from Captain Buscio." Donna?

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

MS. BUSCIO: Dr. Garcia.

Good afternoon, everyone. I'm so excited to be here, as always, and I would like to extend my appreciation to the President and the Association and the Board for allowing me to be here today.

I have exciting news for you. We are opening a fifth office for "A Gift from Captain Buscio" to be available for the southern Firefighters of New Jersey, which will inadvertently alleviate some of the overflow in the northern sites.

Having this exciting news makes me feel so full of gratefulness for what we've accomplished over the last 20 years.

And when I say, "we," I mean all of us. This idea that we founded this program and we are blessed enough to find the most wonderful doctors and medical staff, and you, the Firefighters, who took advantage and supported this program over the last 22 years, we have accomplished something great that I don't think we realize.

We have changed the social norms for Firefighters, Police, and EMS workers, finding preventative care and pursuing preventative care. And that doesn't sound like much, but believe me, there's a trail of emails behind me of people whose lives have been saved. We did that collectively, and I think we need to take a moment and be proud of that.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

MS. BUSCIO: Ah, but our work isn't done. How many Firefighters have future generations, sons and daughters out there, following in their profession; Police, EMS? Plenty.

Well, we have to look out for them. We have to keep "A Gift from Captain Buscio" out there and being utilized and taken advantage of to save more lives of future generations.

Over the years, I can't tell you how many opportunistic people have come up to me and wanted to be on the coattails of "A Gift From Captain Buscio," and I turned them away. I've turned many away because their intentions were for monetary reasons, not the altruistic reasons that this program was founded for.

This program is family taking care of family. We need to remember that.

Today there are plenty of copycats out there, saying, we are just like "A Gift from Captain Buscio." Well, this is your health care. We are a family. I don't believe there's room for substitutes.

And we are doing everything in our power to keep this program meeting all of your medical needs.

In that light, I've heard from leaders saying that some of the appointments were two to three months out. So, I'd like to address that quickly.

As a result of that, we've added appointments to the daily schedule. One of the obstacles we're facing, however, is that there's 20 percent of no-shows in the appointments, and, of course, we can only see so many patients in a day and maintain the quality we've always provided.

So, at this point, I need your support. We're taking steps to create a digital program which will send texts and email messages to remind Firefighters of their appointments. So, you can easily reply "yes" or "no" if you have to cancel, thereby providing more appointments for others.

So, I ask you – this program should be up and running within a month. We're working on the interfacing right now.

But in the interim, if you do have to cancel an appointment, I understand things happen, please, please give the office a call and let them know so your Brother Firefighters can take advantage of that opening.

So those are two things that I wanted to touch on today.

Right now, I would just like to recognize Dr. Edwin Garcia. Dr. Garcia has been – I don't want to say "instrumental," because he's been the whole deal in opening these offices.

And as any program of this magnitude, it's not easy. We've had our obstacles, as everyone does with everything. You know, Amazon came into Newark and said, "Guess what? Two weeks, you're out, we're in." And within one month Dr. Garcia opened a new office in Elizabeth so that we had minimal interruption to our Firefighters' appointments.

He's opened every single office. He's trained the staff. He's dotted the i's and crossed the t's, and has just done a remarkable job.

Please help me in thanking him in showing our appreciation for his work.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

MS. BUSCIO: At this time, I'd like Dr. Garcia to fill you in on the details about the new office.

Please refer to our website for any changes. If you have any problems, any concerns, reach out to your leaders. I'm always available, and we are always listening to your needs. Thank you, very much.

Dr. Garcia?

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

DR. GARCIA: First and foremost, thank you for those kind words.

I would let everybody know that we are opening up this new office in Voorhees, essentially, against my wishes, I'm going to tell you the truth.

We've been trying to open new offices and expand because of the demand, right? You guys are learning about the program, you guys are wanting to come in, and every time that we've spoken about opening a new location, I have always said "no," all right?

The reason why I'm giving in and saying "yes" to this one and committing the two-hour commute to go ahead and make things happen for you guys is because we really need this to happen.

I have always said "no" because my biggest problems, as Donna always mentioned, and just mentioned now, is we never want the quality of what we offer you to ever suffer.

And every time that a business starts getting bigger and bigger and bigger, you always see that something is always left behind. Essentially, the juice keeps getting more and more diluted, the more dispersed that it gets.

We have made it our mission and our goal to make sure that with every single location that we open, you guys never ever feel the difference. Every location is no different than the next. The level of care that you get from our Secaucus office, our Paramus office, our Elizabeth and our Lakewood location will be no different than our new location in Voorhees.

And that's the reason why I've always been against continuing to expand. But luckily, the gods upstairs have, you know, enlightened us and have really been giving us great staff that have been very, very dedicated to the cause. You guys have been more than instrumental in providing feedback. You guys have been the nuts and bolts that continue to hold this program together.

When I first walked into this room, I don't know why, but I felt this great sense of sadness. You know, every time I come to these Conventions, I always have you guys come up and have you guys all thanking me and thanking us for all of the wonderful things we do and for saving your Brother's lives or your child's life or your Chief or co-worker.

And today it's been like a litany of you guys just reminding us that these things are happening more and more and more and more.

And I walk in here and I don't feel the same energy that I always do when I walk into this room.

As we continue to get older we always start to realize that the older that we get, loss is going to happen, but it's happening so prematurely, and that's what's so frightening.

We deal with things every single day. Maybe your job, maybe your home, maybe your children, the stresses of day to day, and we still go to work, put on our happy faces and get the job done, you know.

You guys are putting your lives out there not because you feel like you want to, but because you have to. This is what you signed up to do, but even more importantly, this is what comes out of your heart.

You know, some of you may not even know who is working the next shift in your Firehouse, right? Some of you may not even take the time to get to know your neighbor. Some of you go to work sad and not certain if you're going to make it through the day just because you're exhausted, because you're dealing with a newborn, because you are dealing with an ailing parent, right? Or a dying loved one.

But we still get up every day, we put on our faces and we go out there and we triumph and we get through the day, and sometimes the people around us have no idea.

That's why we are here. We are here to make sure that every last one of you still gets an opportunity to continue to suffer. I mean, it sounds a little bit ironic, right? But you don't have to suffer in silence. We're here to support you, right? We're here to be your ears, we're here to be your voice.

I encourage every one of you, speak to one another, support one another, right? Support programs like this one that dedicate every moment of every hour of every day to making sure that we are providing the best health care out there; staying in tune with the latest equipment, staying in tune with the latest technologies to make sure that we're delivering the best that we can possibly deliver to you, not only by doing the testing, but even more importantly, by following up with you, by telling you what's going on, by giving you information, holding your hand along the whole process and making sure that we're getting you to the dedicated care, even if it may not be within our care team, to make sure that you're still able to go home to your loved ones.

To make sure that you are going to make it to retirement. To make sure that you are going to make it to be able to enjoy all the fruits of your labor, okay?

So again, I just want to remind everybody that, yes, we are opening up our Voorhees office. Our goal is for the end of this year. I'm hoping that we can make that happen, but definitely coming the new year.

Everything that's available in all of our offices will be available in that office location as well.

The Captain Buscio Program is not going to be diluted, it will still stay strong, but we need your help, your commitment, and your dedication.

Thank you.

MS. BUSCIO: God bless you. Thank you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Thank you, Donna.

Our next speaker is from Deborah Hospital, Christine Carlson-Glazer, Vice President of Government and Community Relations.

MS. CARLSON-GLAZER: Good afternoon, everyone.

I am Christine Carlson-Glazer with Deborah Heart and Lung Center's First Responder Health Assessment Program. Thank you, very much, for having us here today.

We're here because of all of you. We know that Firefighters are at an increased risk of cardiovascular disease. Exposure to smoke, heavy lifting and exertion, up and down ladders, on call at a moment's notice, and for those of you that juggle full-time jobs in addition to volunteering to be Firefighters, you are eating on the run. There is no time for exercise, eating healthy.

And sleep? I spoke to one of you earlier today that gets two, two and a half hours, and that's good for them. It's not good for them.

You've got a lot of these additional stressors in your life. You need a cardiovascular risk assessment.

For over 30 years Deborah's been diagnosing and treating Firefighters. And honestly, the number of people we've found and identified serious cardiac issues, that we were able to treat early and avoid a serious or potentially fatal event, is overwhelming.

For those of you who stopped by Room Number 3 today to get some free health screenings, maybe just to pick up a pillbox, get some information about the First Responder Program or our Military Health Services Program – I know there's a lot of overlap for you folks – thank you for coming by today.

For those of you who didn't have a chance, I have it on good word that those pillboxes are being restocked and will be back in tomorrow morning.

But, please stop by tomorrow and see us. Learn a little bit more about us.

The First Responder Health Assessment Program Team is here today to answer any questions, and they are part of your family.

Dawn has been a Volunteer Firefighter, an EMS worker. Angel has been an EMS worker. Her two brothers are Police Officers and also Volunteer Firefighters, and they've served in the Navy. They will take extra specially good care of you, I promise.

If you have colleagues that weren't able to make it here and you'd like us to come out to you and come out to your Fire Stations, to share information, to have a doctor come out and speak to you, we are very happy to do that. So, if you have any interest in that, please let us know and we'll get you on the calendar.

The message I'd like you to leave with here today, it should be a priority for each and every one of you to get a cardiovascular screening. Whether you come to Deborah or somewhere else in your community, it is critically important. Do not put it on the bottom of your list, please.

You put your lives on the line every day, and we're here to save yours.

Thank you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Thank you, Christine.

Next, we have from the New Jersey Fire Museum and Fallen Firefighters Memorial, David Horsnall.

MR. HORSNALL: Good afternoon. President Ordway, thank you and your cohorts for the time to speak about the New Jersey Fire Museum and Fallen Firefighters Memorial.

It's time to tell you a little bit about how we've grown and what's going on. For you that haven't heard about or seen the Museum, we invite you to listen and come and see us at the Museum.

We'd like to tell you about a couple – just a couple things that have changed in the last year or so.

There's been significant improvements to the site, both in structure and site work and landscape work that make it a much more pleasurable experience to arrive on the scene and see what's going on.

There's been a number of pieces of apparatus. Old, some of us would say, not so old, but from the '20s up through the '60s or so.

And there's incredible equipment as well as a lot of new memorabilia in art, photos, pictures, and even run ledgers from some large and not so large cities, makes it an incredible experience to come and join with us.

The most significant change or addition that has now just begun is the work on the Fallen Firefighters Memorial. Thanks to financial assistance from the State Legislature and the Government and through support of Monmouth County and Monmouth County Park Systems, we were able to move forward with that endeavor.

It's exciting. I think it will be a heart-moving experience when it's complete.

I ask you to stop by our table here in the hallway and look at some of the renderings and what we're getting ready to do. We would welcome your comments and your thoughts from all of you Delegates, Life Members, everybody that's interested in this endeavor.

And finally, a couple things. Sure, we, the Museum, want you to come and visit with us at the Museum on a crazy road called Polhemustown Road, just outside of Allentown, New Jersey. Middle of the state, not far off 195, easy to get to.

But there's also a number of local Fire Museums around the state, and I don't – it doesn't matter whether you're talking about Trenton and Newark and the New Brunswick area or other smaller communities.

If there is a Fire Museum or a library of Fire Service in your community, I invite you, I ask you to go see it and appreciate it. Because there's people working hard to put them together, most of the time that deals with local history.

But take your kids, take the probies, get them interested in the history of what really is a profession for everybody in this room, and then come visit with us and enjoy a day just outside of Allentown.

Particularly, a week from this Sunday, September the 24th, is our Open House. It's a chance for us to showcase the collection of Fire apparatus, Fire memorabilia from all over this state that originally was gathered by a guy named Ernie Day. Many of you knew Ernie, and he is the anchor to what started this whole endeavor.

So again, between 9 and 3, September the 24th, no charge, good food, plenty of equipment, happy people, and things for the kids to see and do.

So, it doesn't matter what your position in the Fire Service is, we look forward to seeing you, visiting with you, and having you enjoy time with us.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Thank you.

Next, we have President Anthony Correia from New Jersey State Fire Chiefs Association.

MR. CORREIA: Thank you, President Ordway, and New Jersey State Fire Chiefs Association for having me here.

First of all, the Museum, if you have not taken the time to go see the Museum and the work they're doing, it's really important.

So, I'm honored to be the President, the 37th President of New Jersey State Fire Chiefs Association.

However, in order to get here, I must recognize the Rusling Hose Company that gave me the opportunity and helped me develop the character to be here. And I hope all of you think about the organizations that you belong to, how they helped you develop the character and give you the opportunity to be who you are today.

With that said, before I start my report, the most asked question I get since I've been an Officer in the State Chiefs, "Did I win the Masters."

I'm not a golfer; I didn't golf. The way I got this jacket is Happy Gilmore retired golfing. You all know who Happy Gilmore is, right? And it was for auction, and I won the auction. So, nobody else needs to ask.

With that said, the New Jersey State Fire Chiefs Association held their 118th Annual Convention Meeting yesterday. Some notable events that you all should know about: One, we had Chief Yahr from Lakewood give an excellent presentation about planning for the Fire Service. It was applicable to Career and Volunteer Departments. If you haven't heard him, go to Lakewood, see if he can come to visit you.

Number two, we gave out our first Fire Chief of the Year Award in quite a while.

And, Ed, you gotta help me. This was Edward A. Mullen? Edward A. Mullen, the Chief of Perth Amboy, got that award, deserving of honor.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

MR. CORREIA: The bigger honor is that Edward S. Mullen, I'm getting this all – R. Mullen. See? At least I got D.F.I.S. right yesterday.

Edward R. Mullen retired after 35 years as our Treasurer. Outstanding job, outstanding, and now you stole him away from us, Joe. You got a great man.

So, besides the Convention, Wednesday, we start a new initiative of meet and greet with instructors. I hope next year that you can think about coming a little bit earlier. It was a success, but we build on it.

The other thing we had, again, another great seminar with Chiefs Terpak and Heller, all the reviews I got were outstanding.

So, hopefully, you all can take a little time and come in a little early and join us next year and get some education while enjoying the Convention.

So, our motto on our logo, "In Unity There is Strength." And we have had two major endeavors in the State Chiefs in the last two years. One is reconstituting the New Jersey Fire and EMS Institute.

Along with the New Jersey State, the New Jersey Career, the New Jersey Deputy Chiefs, and the Eastern Division and the Deputy and the Battalion Chiefs Organization and Volunteer Chiefs, I want to make sure, we've got the Institute back up and running.

The Institute is for all of you. It's to represent you. We hear about legislative issues; we hear about other issues. Our goal is to be that unity for the Fire Service.

Years ago, I met with Loretta Weinberg, Assemblywoman from Middlesex County, I believe. I said, "We, the Fire Service." She said, "Who is the Fire Service? Is it this organization, this organization, or this organization?"

We need to have unity as the New Jersey Fire Service.

Another day, I was in the State House and I met with a legislator, said "We're here from the Chiefs."

He said, "Oh, he was already here," and if anybody is around, some of you are old enough that Charlie Augenbach was in there.

We need to have one voice of who we are. We have differences of opinion, but need to get there.

We're having a meet and greet at Anglesea Firehouse today at 1:30 if you can make it.

The second other major initiative is mentoring. We hear about mentoring all the time and the importance of mentoring, the need for mentoring. We started a mentoring program, but there's two parts. One is for all of you that need a mentor, whether it be governmental relations, administration, finance, how to develop interpersonal relationships, check us out, find out more about it.

The other one is to help you develop mentoring programs. I hear the older guys go: The younger people don't want to hear from me. And the kids are going, like, oh, what have you got to say?

I think we can find a marriage. To that gentleman over there, Fuzzy Fazekas started with the Burlington Township Fire Departments, coffees on first Wednesday.

And as we will tell you, we had 400 years of institutional knowledge from six people there. Now, on Saturday, we're going to bring – do it on a Saturday so we can get both the younger and the older guys. You might want to think about doing something like that in your Fire Department.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

MR. CORREIA: Lastly, we are the Fire Service. We're in this to serve others.

So, I ask you, before you go to the Beach Bash tonight, because I'm a proud advocate and last team member, as well as working the Memorial for 16, 17 years, that I see at the Beach Bash an important organization to Fallen Firefighters, that you all go out and meet somebody new and pay it forward and do something for somebody that you're not going to get a payback here in this organization, just to make the Fire Service a little bit better.

Thank you for your time.

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Thank you.

From the New Jersey State Exempt Firemen's Association, we have President Robert Sweeten.

MR. SWEETEN: Good afternoon, Officers, Delegates, Alternates, Life Members, and guests.

President Ordway last night asked me to keep my speech to one hour or less, so I will keep it very brief.

It will tell you how to form one, or you can contact myself, one of the officers, or your county's Executive Committeeman to the Exempt Association.

This year we welcome Quinton Township from Salem County and Rocky Hill from Somerset County into our organization.

The Exempts are coming back strong. The past two summers we've had our normal Convention. We're coming out of the pandemic. We've been meeting in person. So, we're trying to do the best we can for all the Exempt Members in this state.

Our Facebook page has been growing. It serves the entire New Jersey Fire Service with events, training, and Fire news. If you've not already done so, please follow our page.

On behalf of the State Exempt Association, have a productive and enjoyable Convention.

A new physical therapy room was completed. We converted three rooms into residential area and the room is now being used by Guests and the staff. The main dining room is completely renovated.

Long-term planning. As we come out of COVID pandemic, we are also preparing for potential changes in regulations for nursing homes, such as limiting rooms to single Guests.

We're currently researching a feasibility study of a solar farm on our property.

We're in the final process of demolition of the dilapidated house that was on the property that was a rental maintenance nightmare.

We continue to rate as one of the top nursing homes, based on inspections by the State Department of Health and Human Services.

Current eligibility to become a Guest at the Home remains that you must have been an active Firefighter in good standing for one full year, with approval from the Fire Company, and meet the terms and conditions of the Home.

You do not have to be a Member of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association. We can accommodate both men and women Guests at the Home.

The eligibility criteria remains under review as part of our discussion with the New Jersey State Firemen's Association.

We also hired a new Solicitor working on updates on our policies, as well as our partnership with nursing schools, to allow students to train here and supplement our staff.

Summer months bring outdoor activities with our Guests. They enjoy the barbecues as well as the camaraderie of visiting Fire Companies and County Associations. We ask you to consider hosting an event for these Guests.

We invite you to visit the Firemen's Home and meet the staff and visit the Guests and see firsthand how the Home operates.

This is the first time in 125 years that Passaic County has elected a Manager who is a female, Amy DeVirgilio.

Amy, congratulations and welcome aboard.

The Board of Managers remain most grateful to continued support from many businesses, Fire Companies, County Local Associations, all others who donate their time and financial support for the well-being and happiness of the Guests in the Home.

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of New Jersey Firemen's Home which comprise the statement of assets, liabilities, and fund balance—cash basis as of June 30, 2023 and 2022, and the related statements of support revenue and expenses and changes in fund balance—cash basis for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and fund balance—cash basis of New Jersey Firemen's Home as of June 30, 2023 and 2022, and its support revenue and expenses and changes in fund balance for the years then ended, in accordance with the cash basis of accounting as described in Note 1.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared utilizing the cash basis of accounting which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The presented cash basis of accounting is the required method prescribed by the New Jersey Department of Human Services.

Nature of Business

The New Jersey Firemen's Home is located in Boonton, New Jersey. Nursing and residential care are provided to aged and indigent firemen who have served as a member of a New Jersey fire department for a minimum of one year.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For the purpose of the statements of assets, liabilities and fund balance – cash basis, management has defined cash and cash equivalents to be highly liquid investments, which include cash, certificates of deposit, and money market funds.

Medical Fund

The medical fund has been established to collect and disburse funds on behalf of the guests. An individual medical account is maintained for each guest in the New Jersey Firemen's Home. The funds are not segregated, and interest earned on such funds is retained by the New Jersey Firemen's Home. The individual accounts are maintained to record the funds collected and disbursed on behalf of the guests.

The primary sources of funds collected on behalf of the guests include: Social Security benefits, pensions and personal remittances from guests or their families. The primary sources of funds disbursed on behalf of the guests include: room and board charges, medical expenses and various personal expenses. Statements are mailed to guests' families/responsible parties on a quarterly basis. When a receivable has resulted, i.e. more funds disbursed than available, the families/responsible parties are requested to remit such.

Upon admission, guests are requested to grant the New Jersey Firemen's Home a limited power of attorney to execute the aforementioned transactions. Upon the expiration or discharge of a guest, any remaining balance is returned to the guest or the guest's estate after all anticipated expenses have been paid. Such release of funds is approved by the Board of Managers. Should a deceased guest have a balance in excess of \$500 upon death, a statement which lists the executor is required from the local county surrogate.

Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are maintained in the Property Fund. Asset acquisitions with a cost of \$1,000 or more have been capitalized. Depreciation is computed on a straight line basis over the useful lives of the assets generally as follows:

Buildings and Improvements 10-50 years Furniture and Equipment 5-10 years Vehicles 5 years

NOTE I (Continued)

Expenditures for major renewals and betterments that extend the useful lives of property and equipment are capitalized. Expenditures for maintenance and repairs are charged to expense as paid.

Estimates

Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing the financial statements. These estimates and assumptions affect the disclosures relating to the Pension Plan. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Income Taxes

The New Jersey Firemen's Home is exempt from federal income taxes under section 501 of the Internal Revenue Code. It was incorporated as a non-profit organization under the laws of the State of New Jersey.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through August 31, 2023 and August 30, 2022, which are the dates the financial statements were issued.

NOTE 3: GUEST TRUST FUNDS RECEIVABLE

Consists of medical accounts of individual guests for which more funds have been disbursed than are available. Five guests had a combined balance of \$12,753\$ and \$18,027 at June 30, 2023 and 2022, which is greater than 42°_{\circ} and 33°_{\circ} of the totals.

NOTE 4: GUEST TRUST FUNDS PAYABLE

Consists of medical accounts of individual guests for which more funds have been collected than have been disbursed. Five guests had a combined balance of \$102,992 and \$65,192 at June 30, 2023 and 2022, which is greater than 80°_{0} and 64°_{0} of the totals.

NOTE 5: INDIGENT GUEST EXPENSES

Consists of medical accounts of former guests which had balances due to (from) the New Jersey Firemen's Home at the time of discharge expiration. These accounts are deemed uncollectible by the Board of Managers.

NOTE 6: PENSION PLAN

The New Jersey Firemen's Home has a Pension Plan covering substantially all of its managers. The total Pension Plan expenses disbursed during the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022 was \$0 and \$21,008. The organization makes annual contributions to the plan as determined by the organization's finance committee. Effective July 1, 2000 all staff employees are covered under the New Jersey Public Employees Retirement System and do not accrue any further benefits under this plan. Total employer contributions disbursed during the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022 to the New Jersey Public Retirement System were \$733,364 and \$727,285. A comparison of accumulated plan benefits and plan net assets at the most recent valuation dates, July 1, 2023 and 2022 are presented below:

NOTE 7: RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The New Jersey Firemen's Home Medical Fund transferred a net \$202,546 and \$58,821 to the Operating Fund in the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022. Investment fees and bank charges were included in the net transfers. Net transfers to the New Jersey Firemen's Home Property Fund of \$239,044 and \$461,339 were made in the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022. Expenditures for additions are made by the Operating Fund and recorded as interfund transfers. Administrative expenses (consisting primarily of accounting, auditing and actuarial services) of \$16,261 and \$40,091 were paid by the Operating Fund on behalf of the Pension Plan in the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022.

NOTE 8: CONCENTRATION

The primary source of support is the Fire Insurance Tax Revenue (Title 54.18-8) of \$11,388,500 which is the budget request for the year ended June 30, 2024. This amount represents 96% of total support. The budget request for fiscal year ended June 30, 2023 was \$11,991,500, which was received in fiscal year ended June 30, 2022 and represented 95% of total support.

NOTE 9: COMMITMENTS

Effective August 15, 2005, the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into a three year food services management agreement with Unidine Corporation, whereby Unidine Corporation will provide the food, preparation and service, including therapeutic diets for residents, staff, employees and authorized visitors. The initial term was for a three year period, and will renew for one year periods, unless terminated in writing. The cost is based on a daily rate (\$37.58 as of May 1, 2022, the most recent renewal date), and a minimum of 29,120 resident days. Total food service cost relative to this agreement was \$1.098.670 and \$1.012.832 for the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022.

Effective October 17, 2006, the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into an agreement with Healthcare Services Group Inc. (Healthcare) whereby Healthcare will provide all necessary management, supervision, labor and materials to perform housekeeping and laundry services on the premises of the New Jersey Firemen's Home. The New Jersey Firemen's Home will retain responsibility for definitive management of all Healthcare personnel performing under this agreement. All existing housekeeping equipment will be absorbed and utilized by Healthcare in performing its duties. Any repair of, replacement of, or addition to housekeeping equipment will be the responsibility of the New Jersey Firemen's Home. These services have since been cancelled.

Effective May 23, 2022, the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into a one-year agreement with Coreworks LLC to provide the housekeeping and laundry services. The term of service began May 23, 2022 and will continue for five, one-year additional terms unless cancelled by either party within sixty days prior to the end of the current term.

Total expense relative to this agreement was \$589,819 and \$483,033 for the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022.

NOTE 9 (Continued)

On June 28, 2013 the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into a three year agreement with eHealth Solutions Inc., d/b a SigmaCare (since acquired by MatrixCare), whereby MatrixCare will provide a comprehensive Medical Software package allowing the New Jersey Firemen's Home to serve its guests' medical needs with greater efficiency and requires a minimum monthly payment of \$1,862. This agreement will continue with successive one year periods unless either party provides a written termination letter with a 120 day notice. Total expense relative to this agreement was \$18,627 and \$32,558 for the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022.

On July 28,2021 the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into a five year agreement to lease office equipment. This agreement requires a monthly payment of \$815. Future minimum lease payments are as follows:

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared utilizing the cash basis of accounting which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The presented cash basis of accounting is the required method prescribed by the New Jersey Department of Human Services.

Nature of Business

The New Jersey Firemen's Home is located in Boonton, New Jersey. Nursing and residential care are provided to aged and indigent firemen who have served as a member of a New Jersey fire department for a minimum of one year.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For the purpose of the statements of cash receipts and disbursements, management has defined cash and cash equivalents to be highly liquid investments, which include cash, certificates of deposit, and money market funds.

Estimates

Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing the statement of cash receipts and disbursements. These estimates and assumptions affect the disclosures relating to the Pension Plan. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Income Taxes

The New Jersey Firemen's Home is exempt from federal income taxes under section 501 of the Internal Revenue Code. It was incorporated as a non-profit organization under the laws of the State of New Jersey.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through August 31, 2023 and August 26, 2022, which are the dates the statements of cash receipts and disbursements were issued.

NOTE 3: PENSION PLAN

The New Jersey Firemen's Home has a Pension Plan covering substantially all of its managers. The total Pension Plan expenses disbursed during the year ended June 30, 2023 and 2022 was \$0 and \$21,008. The organization makes annual contributions to the plan as determined by the organization's finance committee. Effective July 1, 2000 all staff employees are covered under the New Jersey Public Employees Retirement System and do not accrue any further benefits under this plan. Total employer contributions disbursed during the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022 to the New Jersey Public Retirement System were \$733,364 and \$727,285. A comparison of accumulated plan benefits and plan net assets at the most recent valuation dates, July 1, 2023 and 2022 are presented below:

NOTE 4: RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The New Jersey Firemen's Home Medical Fund transferred a net \$202,546 and \$58,821 to the Operating Fund in the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022. Investment fees and bank charges were included in the net transfers. Net transfers to the New Jersey Firemen's Home Property Fund of \$239,044 and \$461,339 were made in the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022. Expenditures for additions are made by the Operating Fund and recorded as interfund transfers. Administrative expenses (consisting primarily of accounting, auditing and actuarial services) of \$16,261 and \$40,091 were paid by the Operating Fund on behalf of the Pension Plan in the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022.

NOTE 5: CONCENTRATIONS

The primary source of support is the Fire Insurance Tax Revenue (Title 54.18-8) of \$11,388,500 which is the budget request for the year ended June 30, 2024. This amount represents 96% of total support. The budget request for fiscal year ended June 30, 2023 was \$11,991,500, which was received in fiscal year ended June 30, 2022 and represented 95% of total support.

NOTE 6: COMMITMENTS

Effective August 15, 2005, the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into a three year food services management agreement with Unidine Corporation, whereby Unidine Corporation will provide the food, preparation and service, including therapeutic diets for residents, staff, employees and authorized visitors. The initial term was for a three year period, and will renew for one year periods, unless terminated in writing. The cost is based on a daily rate (\$37.58 as of May 1, 2022, the most recent renewal date), and a minimum of 29,120 resident days. Total food service cost relative to this agreement was \$1,098,670 and \$1,012,832 for the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022.

Effective October 17, 2006, the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into an agreement with Healthcare Services Group Inc. (Healthcare) whereby Healthcare will provide all necessary management, supervision, labor and materials to perform housekeeping and laundry services on the premises of the New Jersey Firemen's Home. The New Jersey Firemen's Home will retain responsibility for definitive management of all Healthcare personnel performing under this agreement. All existing housekeeping equipment will be absorbed and utilized by Healthcare in performing its duties. Any repair of, replacement of, or addition to housekeeping equipment will be the responsibility of the New Jersey Firemen's Home. These services have since been cancelled.

Effective May 23, 2022, the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into a one-year agreement with Corcworks LLC to provide the housekeeping and laundry services. The term of service began May 23, 2022 and will continue for five, one-year additional terms unless cancelled by either party within sixty days prior to the end of the current term.

Total expense relative to this agreement was \$589,819 and \$483,033 for the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022.

On June 28, 2013 the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into a three year agreement with eHealth Solutions Inc., d/b/a SigmaCare, (since acquired by MatrixCare) whereby MatrixCare will provide a comprehensive Medical Software package allowing the New Jersey Firemen's Home to serve its guests' medical needs with greater efficiency and requires a minimum monthly payment of \$1,862. This agreement will continue with successive one year periods unless either party provides a written termination letter with a 120 day notice. Total expense relative to this agreement was \$18,627 and \$32,558 for the years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022.

On June 28, 2021 the New Jersey Firemen's Home entered into a five year agreement to lease office equipment. This agreement requires a monthly payment of \$815. Future minimum payments are as follows:

- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting
 estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the New Jersey Firemen's Home Employees' Pension Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

Report on Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

Our audits were conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements as a whole. The supplemental schedules, Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at Year end) and (Acquired and Disposed of Within a Year) are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion, the information in the accompanying schedules is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole, and the form and content are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NEW JERSEY FIREMEN'S HOME EMPLOYEES' PENSION PLAN NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JUNE 30, 2023 and 2022

NOTE 1: Description of Plan

The following brief description of the New Jersey Firemen's Home Employees' Pension Plan is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a defined benefit pension. All non-union employees entered the plan on the July 1st nearest later of the last day of their first year of service and age 21. Effective July 1, 1998, only those employees who completed at least 1,000 hours of service in a plan year accrued pension benefits. Effective July 1, 1999, members of the Board of Managers are credited with 83 1/3 hours for each month they serve on the Board. Effective July 1, 2000, all staff employees are covered under the New Jersey Public Employees Retirement System and will not accrue any further benefits under this Plan.

Pension Protection Act of 2006

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 (PPA) was signed into law on August 17, 2006 and is generally effective for Plan Years beginning after 2007. PPA amended the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) under which increased responsibility had been placed on the Plan's Enrolled Actuary and the selection of the actuarial assumptions. In an attempt to strengthen the financial stability of all defined benefit plans, PPA substantially changed the way funding requirements are determined. The Worker, Retiree and Employer Recovery Act of 2008, which was signed into law on December 23, 2008, included technical corrections to PPA. The Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) was signed into law on July 6, 2012. The Highway and Transportation Funding Act of 2014 (HATFA) was signed into law on August 8, 2014. MAP-21 and HATFA contained Pension Funding Relief provisions.

The actuarial cost method (funding method) to be used to determine the Minimum Required Contribution under PPA is an unprojected unit credit cost method.

PPA prescribes the use of segment interest rates for determining the present value of benefits. These segment rates are based on the corporate bond yield curve for certain investment grade bonds that mature at three different times (less than 5 years, between 5 and 20 years, and after 20 years). Alternatively, a full yield curve can be used, if elected. PPA added the calculation of an Effective Rate which is the equivalent single rate that will produce the same accrued liability (the Funding Target) as the segment rates used for funding. PPA further prescribes the use of specific mortality tables which will be published periodically by the Secretary of the Treasury.

MAP-21 changed the method of calculating the segment interest rates resulting in a reduction in Plan liabilities and minimum required contribution. Beginning with the 2008 actuarial valuation, the prescribed assumptions will be reflected, where applicable, and revised each year.

The balance of the actuarial assumptions will continue to reasonably reflect the Plan's experience. As part of the annual report to the Internal Revenue Service, the Plan's Enrolled Actuary must prepare an "actuarial statement" which includes an opinion that these nonprescribed actuarial assumptions reasonably reflect the Plan's experience and expectations and represent the 'best estimate' of anticipated experience under the Plan. No changes, other than those prescribed by law, are required at this time.

NEW JERSEY FIREMEN'S HOME EMPLOYEES' PENSION PLAN NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JUNE 30, 2023 and 2022

NOTE 1 (Continued)

Pension Benefits

Participants with three or more years of participation were previously entitled to annual pension benefits beginning at normal retirement age (65) equal to \$16.67 multiplied by benefit years, not to exceed 30 benefit years, to a maximum of \$500 per month and a minimum of \$100 provided they had 10 or more benefit years. Effective July 1, 2002, a participant's normal pension benefit shall provide a monthly payment equal to \$83.33 multiplied by his benefit years up to, but not exceeding 10 benefit years, to a maximum of \$833.33. The Plan permits early retirement at age 55 with a minimum of 10 years of service. Participants may elect to receive their pension benefits in the form of a joint and survivor annuity. If participants terminate before rendering 5 years of service, they forfeit the right to receive the portion of their accumulated plan benefits. Effective July 1, 2005, normal retirement date has been amended to be the first of the month after the age 62 (from 65) and the later completion of three years of plan participation.

Death Benefits

If a participant dies before benefits commence, but after the interest in the Accrued Benefit has become vested to some extent, his/her Spouse shall receive the survivor annuity benefit which would have been payable if the participant had elected to receive the Standard Annuity commencing the day before death, or, if the participant had not yet reached the earliest retirement age under the Plan, the benefit which would have been payable based on the actual Accrued Benefit but assuming that the participant had survived to the earliest retirement age under the Plan, had elected to receive the Standard Annuity, and had died on the following day, subject to the same actuarial reduction normally applicable on account of the commencement of benefits before the Normal Retirement Date. The Administrator may pay the Spouse, in lieu of monthly payments, a lump sum which is the Actuarial Equivalent of the survivor annuity, provided the lump sum is less than \$5,000.

If the participant dies before benefits commence while in active service, but after Normal Retirement Date, the Spouse, if any, shall receive the survivor annuity benefit which would have been payable assuming that the participant had elected to receive the Standard Annuity, and had died on the following day.

If the participant dies after benefits commence, any remaining benefits under the Standard Annuity or the alternative benefit form, if any, that was elected shall be paid to the Spouse or other Beneficiary, as the case may be.

Disability Benefits

If Service is terminated by Disability, the participant shall be eligible to receive a Disability Pension Benefit. The Disability Pension Benefit shall provide monthly payments of an amount such that the benefit is the Actuarial Equivalent of the Accrued Benefit at termination. If the participant is disabled, he/she may not elect to receive an alternative form of benefit other that the Standard Annuity. Disability Pension Benefits shall begin on the first day of the month following the fifth full calendar month of Disability, and shall end only if Disability ends before the Normal Retirement date. A participant will not be considered disabled unless he she qualifies for disability benefits under the Federal Social Security Act or Veterans Disability Act.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Estimate

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by its investment advisers and custodian. See note 5 for a discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Actuarial Present Value of Accumulated Plan Benefits

Accumulated plan benefits are those future periodic payments, including lump sum distributions, that are attributable under the plan's provisions to the service participants have rendered. Accumulated plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to (a) retired or terminated participants or their beneficiaries, (b) beneficiaries of participants who have died, and (c) present participants or their beneficiaries. Effective July 1, 2002, benefits under the plan are based on participants' benefit years multiplied by \$83.33 per year not to exceed \$833.33 per month. The benefits payable under all circumstances - retirement, death, disability, and termination of employment - are included, to the extent they are deemed attributable to participant service rendered to the valuation date.

The actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits is determined by an actuary from BPAS Actuarial and Pension Services, LLC, and is that amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to adjust the accumulated plan benefits to reflect the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as for death, disability, withdrawal or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

The significant actuarial assumptions used in the valuations as of July 1, 2023 and July 1, 2022 were life expectancy of participants. The base mortality tables for July 1, 2023 and July 1, 2022 are the sex distinct RP-2014 mortality tables for healthy annuitants adjusted backwards to 2006 with Scale MP-2014. The base mortality table is adjusted by projecting mortality improvements using Scale MP-2017 from the year 2006 through 2019 with an additional projection period of 8 years for males and 9 years for females. For ages below 80, the additional projection period is increased by one year for each year below 80; for ages above 80; the additional projection period is reduced (but not below zero) by one third year for each year above 80.

The interest rate used to discount the obligation for July 1, 2023 and July 1, 2022 was 7%, including a reduction of 0% to reflect anticipated administrative expenses associated with providing benefits.

NOTE 2 (Continued)

The foregoing actuarial assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. Were the Plan to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits. The computations of the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits were made as July 1, 2023 and July 1, 2022. Had the valuations been performed as of June 30, there would be no material differences.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through August 31, 2023, which is the date the financial statements were issued.

NOTE 3: FUNDING POLICY

The New Jersey Firemen's Home's funding policy is to make annual contributions to the Plan in amounts that are usually within the minimum required contribution and maximum recommended contribution as computed by BPAS Actuarial and Pension Services, LLC. The minimum required contributions were \$96,606 and \$95,259 for years beginning July 1, 2022 and 2021. The Finance Committee of the Plan sponsor elected to contribute \$0 and \$21,008 in plan years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022.

NOTE 4: PLAN TERMINATION

In the event the Plan terminates, the net assets of the Plan will be allocated, as prescribed by ERISA and its related regulations, generally to provide the following benefits in the order indicated:

- Benefits former participants or their beneficiaries have been receiving for at least three years, or that
 employees eligible to retire for that three-year period would have been receiving if they had retired
 with benefits in the normal form of annuity under the Plan. The priority amount is limited to the
 lowest benefit that was payable or would have been payable under plan provisions in effect at any
 time during the five years preceding Plan termination.
- Other vested benefits insured by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (PBGC) (a U.S. governmental agency) up to the applicable limitations (discussed below).
- All other vested benefits (that is, vested benefits not insured by the PBGC).
- All nonvested benefits.

NOTE 4 (Continued)

Certain benefits under the Plan are insured by the PBGC if the Plan terminates. Generally, the PBGC guarantees most vested normal age retirement benefits, early retirement benefits, and certain disability and survivor's pensions. However, the PBGC does not guarantee all types of benefits under the Plan, and the amount of benefit protection is subject to certain limitations. Vested benefits under the Plan are guaranteed at the level in effect on the date of the Plan's termination. However, there is a statutory ceiling on the amount of an individual's monthly benefit that the PBGC guarantees. That ceiling applies to those pensioners who elect to receive their benefits in the form of a single-life annuity and are at least 65 years old at the time of retirement or plan termination (whichever comes later). For younger annuitants or for those who elect to receive their benefits in some form more valuable than a single-life annuity, the corresponding ceilings are actuarially adjusted downward.

Whether all participants receive their benefits should the Plan terminate at some future time will depend on the sufficiency, at that time, of the Plan's net assets to provide those benefits and may also depend on the level of benefits guaranteed by the PBGC.

NOTE 5: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefit.

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs other than quoted market prices included in Level 1 that are either directly or indirectly observable for the asset, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs are only used when level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of certificates of deposit, mutual funds, money market funds, US Government Securities and preferred stocks is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year end.

Level 2 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of corporate bonds is based on quoted prices for similar assets in active markets.

NOTE 6: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Plan contributions are made and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

NOTE 7: TAX STATUS

The plan obtained its latest determination letter on September 28, 2018, in which the Internal Revenue Service states that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue code (IRC). The Plan has not been amended since receiving the determination letter.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8: ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES/RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Operating Fund of the New Jersey Firemen's Home. For plan years ended June 30, 2023 and 2022 those expenses, consisting primarily of fees paid to actuaries and auditors, were \$16,261 and \$40,091, respectively. Those expenses are excluded from these financial statements. Certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Legislative Committee Annual Convention Report September 15, 2023

To All Chiefs, Delegates, Alternates, Life Members, and Guests.

This is the Annual Convention Report for the Legislative Committee. The committee meets once annually and communicates weekly.

We are in the second year of the 220th Legislative Session which ends on January 9, 2024. The total bills that were introduced as of today are 10,177. The Legislative Committee is currently tracking 170 bills separated into two categories, 132 from Fire & Emergency Services and 48 from Pensions.

There have been 6 of our tracked bills signed into Law this Legislative Session (A-2158, A-4127, A4107, SJR-23, S-3090, and A-5275).

Two of our tracked bills have passed in both the Assembly and Senate and are currently sitting on the Governor's Desk waiting to be signed (A-5179 and S-861).

The Governor has signed 320 bills into law to date and currently has forty-seven bills sitting on his desk waiting to be signed.

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: We'll now have the report of the Resolution Committee; Frank Cavallo and Larry Wood.

MR. WOOD: Okay. Our first Resolution would be the report document distributed at the Caucus and Convention, as published in the Red Book, and appears on the website to be accepted and approved.

COUNSEL CAVALLO: The second question on the ballot is: "Shall the Secretary of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association cast a ballot affirming the results of the election of Executive County Committee Members and Managers of the New Jersey Firemen's Home, which occurred at their respective County Caucuses?"

The third question on the ballot is, "Should the 2028 New Jersey State Firemen's Association Annual Convention be held in the City of Wildwood, New Jersey?"

We have five Resolutions.

Mr. Wood is going to read a summary of each and I will give the Committee's response.

MR. WOOD: Okay. That first Resolution is from the Borough of Clayton, Firemen's Relief Association.

Gloucester County proposed that the New Jersey State Firemen's Association amend Article 7, so Section 3 of the Constitution and By-laws to include Life Members be approved.

The Resolution is specifically requesting New Jersey State Firemen's Association to amend Article 6 - Article 7, excuse me, section of the Constitution and By-laws to allow for Burial Benefits to be paid on behalf of a Life Member of the Convention who has not served the required 84 months to be eligible for the Burial Benefit.

COUNSEL CAVALLO: Resolution Committee's response: The title Life Member is bestowed upon a Member who has attended 10 sessions of the Convention, the Member becomes a Life Member of the Convention.

This title does not mean that a Member is qualified or working towards qualification under the rules of the Association.

In order to be qualified or working towards qualification, a Member must participate in Fire-related activities, including responding to calls and drills and other activities.

Accordingly, the Committee has recommended a "no" vote.

MR. WOOD: Resolution Number 2: "Clayton Fire Service requested the Association seek amendment to NJSA 43.17-9 to allow the age of eligibility to 16 years."

COUNSEL CAVALLO: Individuals who are 16 years of age cannot be on Fire apparatus and cannot become a certified Firefighter.

Accordingly, changing the age of eligibility would not provide a path towards Membership of the Association, since they cannot perform the Fire-related activities that also lead toward qualification.

Accordingly, the Committee has recommended a "no" vote.

MR. WOOD: Okay. Number 3 is from Deptford Fire Department.

The Resolution specifically requests New Jersey State Firemen's Association to amend Article 7, Section 2 of the General Relief Fund rules to be added subject to the list of individuals eligible to receive payment at Burial Benefit.

COUNSEL CAVALLO: The Burial Claim is to make sure that a Firefighter receives a proper burial. It is not an insurance policy.

Accordingly, the committee has recommended a "no" vote.

MR. WOOD: Okay. Number 4 is from Harrison Township.

The Resolution specifically requests New Jersey State Firemen's Association to amend Article 3, Section 14 of the Constitution and By-laws to change the process penalties for failure to file required requests.

COUNSEL CAVALLO: The rules and regulations currently in place provide a system of checks and balances to ensure that all Local Officers responsible for filing the required reports do their job.

Accordingly, the committee has recommended a "no" vote.

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MR. WOOD: And Number 5 would be from Woodstown Fire Department.

The Resolution specifically requests the New Jersey State Firemen's Association to seek an amendment to the existing status to require written notification by New Jersey State Firemen's Association to any Member removed from the Membership roll.

COUNSEL CAVALLO: The State Office maintains current addresses for the Members.

Accordingly, this would not be a task that they could possibly complete, and the Committee has recommended a "no" vote.

Thank you.

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: We will now have the report of the Certified Public Accountant, Treasurer Ed Mullen.

TREASURER MULLEN: Concerning the New Jersey State Firemen's Association financial statements for the year-ended June 30th, 2022, here's the abridged version of the auditor's opinion.

The financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and net assets of the Association as of June 30th, 2022 and 2021, and its revenues and expenses for the years then ended in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

Notes to Financial Statements (Modified Cash Basis) June 30, 2023 and 2022

1. Organization and Tax Status

New Jersey State Firemen's Association (the "Association") is a not-for-profit corporation that was established through New Jersey State legislation. Its expressed purpose is to maintain a General Relief Fund that provides burial benefits to qualifying members. The Special Relief Fund was initiated to allow relief to be paid to those applicants of associations that cannot afford to satisfy the needs of an applicant when a major loss occurs due to illness or other incidents. The initial contribution of \$2,468,467 was made May 15, 2003. Benefits were made available beginning January 1, 2004.

The Association is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code").

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting and Use of Estimates

The financial statements are prepared on the cash basis, modified for investments, which are stated at cost, and certain assets and liabilities related to insurance claims. In addition, the Association is capitalizing all costs related to its new building and is subsequently depreciating these costs. Consequently, revenue is recognized when received rather than when earned and expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligations are incurred. Management has determined that the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("US GAAP"), as described above is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances.

Net Asset Presentation

Net assets and revenues, expenses, gains and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Accordingly, the Association's net assets are classified as with or without donor restrictions. At June 30, 2023 and 2022, all the Association's net assets are without donor restrictions.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash held in banks and money market funds with maturities of three months or less at the time of purchase.

Cash Held for Affiliates

Cash held for affiliates represent cash held by the Association for local associations.

Investments

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a settlement date basis. Realized gains and losses on investments are calculated based on the average cost method for mutual funds and first-in, first-out method for all other securities, and are reflected in the statements of revenue, expenses and change in net assets. Dividend income and interest income are recorded when received.

Notes to Financial Statements (Modified Cash Basis) June 30, 2023 and 2022

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment is carried at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful life of the assets when placed into service. The Association uses a useful life of 39 years for the building, 7 years for furniture and 5 years for equipment.

Revenue Recognition

Insurance companies' tax

The Association receives a 2% levy on all fire insurance premiums from various insurance companies not domiciled in New Jersey. In addition, the Association receives a 3% surplus line on a quarterly basis from the Producers and Agents, who are in charge of the insurance policies. These monies when received are distributed to New Jersey Boroughs/Townships that have local relief associations. The Association will then retain the remainder of the premium after disbursement is completed. These monies are recognized as revenue when received and are recorded as revenue without donor restrictions.

State of New Jersey (999 Account)

The Association will at times receive a 2% premium that cannot be directly correlated to a specific Borough or Township. This money is dedicated by the Association to the New Jersey Firemen's Home for their annual operating expenditures. Any remaining amount not required for the New Jersey Firemen's Home remains in the Association's general fund. These amounts are recognized as revenue when received and is recorded as revenue without donor restrictions.

Functional Allocation of Expenses

The cost of providing various programs and other activities had been summarized on a functional basis in the statements of revenue, expenses and change in net assets. All costs are direct expenses to each functional category. Program services consist of benefit payments. All other expenses are considered management and general and unallocated payments to affiliated organizations.

Concentration of Credit Risk

Financial instruments that potentially subject the Association to significant concentrations of credit risk consist principally of cash and cash equivalents, cash held for affiliates and investments. Deposits held at financial institutions insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ("FDIC") are insured up to \$250,000. As of June 30, 2023 and 2022, the Association's uninsured cash and cash equivalents and cash held for affiliates balances on deposit totaled approximately \$2,924,000 and \$5,577,000.

Investments are managed by a professional investment management firm and are monitored by the Executive Board and an investment advisor engaged by the Association

Notes to Financial Statements (Modified Cash Basis) June 30, 2023 and 2022

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Accounting for Uncertainty in Income Taxes

The Association recognizes the effect of income tax positions only if those positions are more likely than not to be sustained. Management has determined that the Association had no uncertain tax positions that would require financial recognition or disclosure. The Association is no longer subject to examinations by the applicable taxing jurisdictions for periods prior to fiscal 2021.

Subsequent Events Evaluation by Management

Management has evaluated subsequent events for disclosure and/or recognition in the financial statements through the date that financial statements were available to be issued, which date is January 3, 2024.

3. Investments

Investments are carried at cost regardless of fair value at the end of the year. Gains and losses on investments are recorded upon disposition of the investment rather than providing for such gains and losses as they occur.

Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit
 procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of
 expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no
 such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 2022 and 2021

1. Plan Description

The following brief description of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association Employees' Retirement Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information. The Plan is a defined benefit pension plan.

The Plan is administered by the New Jersey State Firemen's Association (the "Association"). The Custodian of the Plan is U.S. Bank Institutional Trust and Custody ("U.S. Bank"). The Association has appointed U.S. Bank to hold investment assets and perform most administrative duties.

Pension Benefits

Employees are eligible for participation in the Plan after attaining age 21 and completing one year of service. Participants become fully vested in the Plan after 5 years of service. However, 10 years of service is required for early retirement benefits.

Benefits for participants retiring upon reaching the normal retirement age of 65 are based on 65% of the average annual compensation reduced pro-rata for years less than 25, based on the previous 12 month period. The Plan also provides a cost of living adjustment.

An employee may elect early retirement after having reached age 55 and having completed 10 years of service. Benefits upon election of early retirement are reduced for each month by which the retirement date precedes age 65.

The normal form of benefit payment is a life annuity with 10 years certain for single employees and a joint and survivorship annuity basis for employees. Several other options in the method of benefit payment are also available.

Participants who have attained the age of 70½ and are still working must commence collection of their pension benefits. In addition, participants will be able to accrue benefits for service beyond the age of 65.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("US GAAP"). The Plan is not required to make certain Department of Labor required disclosures as the number of eligible participants is less than 100.

Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 2022 and 2021

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with US GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein; disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits at the date of the financial statements and changes therein. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Fair Value Measurements

The Plan follows US GAAP guidance on Fair Value Measurements which defines fair value and establishes a fair value hierarchy organized into three levels based upon the input assumptions used in pricing assets. Level 1 inputs have the highest reliability and are related to assets with unadjusted quoted prices in active markets. Level 2 inputs relate to assets with other than quoted prices in active markets which may include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities or other inputs which can be corroborated by observable market data. Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs and are used to the extent that observable inputs do not exist.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Fair value of investments in shares of mutual funds are valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset values of shares held by the Plan at year end. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Gains or losses on sales of investments are based on the average cost of investments. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well held during the year.

Accumulated Plan Benefits

Accumulated plan benefits are those estimated future periodic payments that are attributable under the Plan's provisions for services rendered by the employees at the valuation date. Accumulated plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to present employees or their beneficiaries. Benefits for retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries are based on Plan provisions at the time of retirement.

Administrative and Investment Expense

Administrative and investment expenses are paid by the Plan. Investment expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 2022 and 2021

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded upon distribution.

Risks and Uncertainties

The assets of the Plan are primarily financial instruments which are monetary in nature. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonable to expect the changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect amounts in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Plan contributions are made and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

Concentration of Credit Risk

Financial instruments that potentially subject the Plan to concentrations of credit and market risk consist principally of cash and cash equivalents including certificates of deposit, and investments held at financial institutions. Deposits held at financial institutions insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ("FDIC") are insured up to \$250,000. Investment holdings at financial institutions insured by the Securities Investor Protection Corporation ("SIPC") are insured up to \$500,000 (\$250,000 for cash holdings). At times cash balances may exceed the FDIC and/or the SIPC limit. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, the Plan's uninsured cash and cash equivalents including certificates of deposit on deposit totaled approximately \$3,251,000 and \$2,938,000. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, the Plan's uninsured investment holdings totaled approximately \$3,898,000 and \$4,538,000.

At December 31, 2022 and 2021, one diversified fixed income mutual fund, affiliated with the Custodian, represented 100% of the Plan's investment portfolio.

Subsequent Events Evaluation by Management

Management has evaluated subsequent events for disclosure and/or recognition in the financial statements through the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, which date is August 31, 2023.

Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 2022 and 2021

3. Certificates of Deposit

Certificates of deposit are stated at cost plus any accrued interest (which approximates fair value). The certificates of deposit at December 31, 2022, bear interest ranging from .15% to 1.00% and mature at various dates from June 2024 through June 2025. Subsequent to year end, the certificates of deposit held by the Plan were liquidated.

4. Investments

As of and for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021 all of the Plan's investments, which consists of one diversified mutual fund, bought, sold and held was a Level 2 investment.

5. Actuarial Information

Accumulated plan benefits are those future periodic payments that are attributable under the Plan's provisions for the service employees have rendered. They include benefits expected to be paid for (a) retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries, (b) beneficiaries of employees who have died, and (c) present employees or their beneficiaries. The accumulated plan benefits for active employees are based on 65% of the average annual compensation reduced pro-rata for years less than 25, based on the previous 12-month period. Benefits payable under all circumstances including retirement, death, disability, and termination of employment are included to the extent they are deemed attributable to employee services rendered to the valuation date.

The actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits is determined by an independent actuary and is that amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to adjust the accumulated plan benefits to reflect the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as for death, disability, withdrawal, or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment. The significant actuarial assumptions used in the valuations as of December 31, 2022 and 2021 were (a) life expectancy of participants (the mortality table RP2022 for 2022 and RP2021 for 2021), (b) an assumed retirement of the earlier of age 55 and 10 years of service or age 65 and five years of service and (c) an assumed average rate of return of 3.00% for 2022 and 2021.

The foregoing actuarial assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. Were the Plan to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits.

6. Funding Policy

The Association's policy is to fund the Plan annually at the minimum level required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA") regulations as computed by an independent actuary.

7. Income Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the plan administrator by a letter dated March 30, 2018, that the Plan and related trust were designed in accordance with the applicable regulations of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. The plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 2022 and 2021

7. Income Tax Status (continued)

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine examinations by taxing jurisdictions for periods since 2019; however, there are currently no examinations for any tax periods in progress.

8. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Association has the right to terminate, discontinue making contributions to, amend or modify the Plan at any time, acting through written resolution of the controlling entity of the Plan. Upon termination of the Plan, participants will become fully vested in their benefits earned to date.

Whether all participants receive their benefits should the Plan terminate at some future time will depend on the sufficiency at that time, of the Plan's net assets to provide for accumulated benefit obligations and may also depend on the financial condition of the Plan sponsor and the level of benefits guaranteed by the PBGC.

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Okay. We will now go to unfinished business. Will you turn on microphone number six.

MR. REED: Is it on? Okay. Very good, thank you.

Brothers and Sister Firefighters, please listen to what I have to say that could affect someone in each one of your Departments.

My name is Jim Reed, I'm President of the Deptford Township Firemen's Relief Association, and our Association has submitted Resolution Number 6 to Line-of-Duty Deaths.

I think we're still at Resolution Number 6, am I correct in saying that.

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Yes, sir.

MR. REED: So please remember that, Resolution Number 6, because I'm going to say it a few times.

The current By-laws, the approved claim, shall be determined by the Advisory Committee to the surviving spouse, civil union partner, domestic partner, children, mother or father, caregiver, or funeral home. We are proposing to add the word, "siblings," meaning your brothers and sisters, to Section 16A and 16B.

Retired Chief Jeff Pfeiffer of 25 years was not married, his parents were both deceased, had no children. The only surviving family member is his brother, Retired Battalion Chief, Chris Pfeiffer. As you can see, the Fire Department runs deep in that family.

Still active Retired Chief Jeff Pfeiffer drove the second-due engine on an alarm response. At the completion of the alarm, Retired Chief Jeff Pfeiffer backed the apparatus into the engine room, took two steps out of the engine cab, collapsed on the engine room floor.

CPR was started immediately by the Members of the Department. One of those Members was his own brother, Chris Pfeiffer. Imagine that, having to do CPR on your own brother.

Now, because siblings are not mentioned in the By-laws of the state, his brother, Chris, was denied the three times the amount of the Line-of-Duty Death.

How sad our State Officers who represent us would suggest a "no" vote on this matter? How sad is that? How sad.

Please join our Department and do the right thing and vote "yes" on Resolution Number 6. Thank you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Thank you.

Please turn microphone number four on. Is there anyone by microphone number four?

MR. GEBLEY: Yes. My name is Joe Gebley, Secretary of Woodstown, Salem County Relief Association.

The main reason for our Resolution is we have a Member who has been denied his service at no fault of his own.

At our Caucus last month, we were advised by the Resolution Committee that it would be an impossible task to monitor and maintain all 57,000 addresses in the State Association.

Our challenges – we're asking when a Member is removed from the active list, that they, the Member, be notified either in writing or by an email.

The current application that was revised in May of 19 has the applying Member's email address, along with their postal address.

The notification would not be that impossible, as an email address hardly ever changes, as opposed to a postal one.

President Ordway and his Officers have done a tremendous job expanding our handling of our business transactions via computers in the past several years. Use of that email address for making the notifications would be beneficial.

Lack of protocol, i.e., no green sheets posted in the Fire Station. You get a notice every time you get a package from the President regarding these green sheets being put in the Firehouse. Lack of notification to the Fire Chief, lack of communication between two Association Secretaries, and poor coordination of two Fire Companies of one Association has been determined to be the cause of the lost service time.

Is it any different than situations that currently exist in several of our cities with fellow Brother and Sister Paid professional Firefighters being denied service benefits due to the lack of Local Association Secretaries not having State Association applications completed when the Members begin their employment as Paid Firefighters and getting to join their Local Associations.

In other words, the Local Secretaries need to do a better job so active serving Members receive their approved time they provided when it's no fault of their own.

We can make it a little more manageable for those addresses if we revise and modify the active Membership Form 109, have their addresses be put on there in case there's some changes. This way, when the green sheets are posted, they will be there.

Our Association is requesting your "yes" vote on this Resolution to eliminate Members serving their time and not receiving credit where credit is due when they are unknowingly removed from the rolls of the Relief Association.

Thank you for your support.

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Thank you for your comments.

Are we going back to microphone number six?

MR. PFEIFFER: Chris Pfeiffer, Deptford Fire Department.

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: You're on.

MR. PFEIFFER: Chris Pfeiffer, Deptford Fire Department.

It was my brother that passed away on March 24th. On March 23rd, he suffered a cardiac arrest. And on March 24th, I had to make the decision that no, nobody wants to make, and that was to turn off the life support to my brother.

It was me that had to make that decision, because I'm the only closest living relative that he's had. And to sit there and tell me that I'm not immediate family, saddens me.

There's no two closer people than there were, me and my brother. We did everything together from playing Matchbox, drag racing cars, Fire Company, all the years we worked together side by side. He was my Chief; I was his Assistant. He groomed me to be Chief. Eighteen years later, I gave it back to him, and he was my Chief again.

He put his life on the line for us. And then for me to be told I'm not immediate family, well, guess what? When the insurance bills came out and the medical bills came back that weren't paid by the insurance, they didn't say, hey, you're not immediate family, you don't have to pay them. Yes, I had to pay them.

It's a disgrace. I don't know what else it takes to be immediate family than what we had.

Also, I look at the other one, "caretaker." Well, what designates a caretaker? There's nothing I didn't do for him or he didn't do for me. He didn't have a wife; he didn't have children to take care of him; our parents had deceased.

I don't care if he had a toothache, I was there for him. If he had a flu, cold, whatever, I was the one getting him medicine, I was the one making sure he was eating. I was the one checking on him all the time.

Does that not make you a caretaker?

If he were to survive that and came home, it would have been me taking care of him.

So, I'm going to leave this with two things I'm going to ask of everybody, please. When you leave here, look at your Company now, look at your Company in the past, and look at your Company in the future. If you don't think you're going to have Members that fall under this same category, you better open up your eyes. So please think about that.

And the other thing is, tomorrow when you return, please vote Number 6. This can't go on this way. A sibling is immediate family. We deserve to be recognized as that.

I wasn't even recognized as being a family member here today for my brother. That was a disgrace. When they read out the Line-of-Duty Deaths with the family members, my name — no name was given for my brother. Here I am. So, I leave you with that.

Thank you.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Thank you.

Is there any other unfinished business? Any unfinished business?

Next item I have is, if I'm not mistaken, if you turn your attention to Section G1, the first row of Section G1, the second seat from the right, you'll see a gentleman there by the name of Konrad Mellert.

Konrad Mellert from Warren County is retiring this year after serving 40 continuous years as Executive Committeeman for Warren County. And I want to express my thanks to him for his service to this organization.

CONVENTION BODY: (Round of applause.)

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Thank you, Konrad.

Is there any new business to come before this body?

Please rise for the Benediction. Please have the courtesy to stay for the Benediction.

I'm sorry, I did not see the light. Microphone number one. I apologize. That was my fault.

MR. HEFLICH: Listen, I'll be quick, Brothers and Sisters, please.

The young lady's name was mentioned, she was voted on to represent the Bergen County – I mean N.J. State Firemen's Home. Please, she would be an asset to the Home. I just wish to give her a round of applause, please, and make her feel welcome. That's all I gotta say.

Thank you.

PRESIDENT ORDWAY: Thank you, George.

CHAPLAIN DAN SCHAFER: My brother, I'm sorry for your loss and I hope you feel the presence of your brother through the Brothers and Sisters here.

I just have a few short words. I know you want to hit the road, but I want to — the world is a different world now, and I want to leave a couple of words with you that I hope helps get you through the future.

Strengthen that which remains. Strengthen that which remains.

We live in a world that changes every day. We have no guarantee of tomorrow; we know that. In Proverbs, it says: "Boast not thyself of tomorrow. For thou knowest not what a day may bring forth."

So, what's next? What's next is at the expense of losing what was left. In spite of what we've lost, we're still here. So, how can we move from what's now without remembering what was then. But don't get lost in what's now. And never miss what will be.

Never chase people who leave you or walk away from you. If they were with you, they would have stayed with you. Strengthen that which remains.

We are a fellowship. We're a living, functioning fellowship. You can't outlive your history or your destiny, but you can live your reality.

And I have one more verse for you in Hebrews: "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen."

And as we look around this room, we see the evidence of men and women who love this state, that love this country, and every one of you would give your life, if you had to, to have a better day.

Thank you, Father. We've come to the end of this Session, but, Lord, we face a world that is different than it was a couple of years ago, and we will need each other more than we've ever needed each other.
